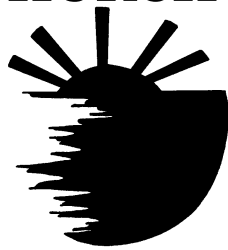

Job 38:1–11

L The Old Testament Reading for The Fifth Sunday after Pentecost is from Job thirty-eight.



Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind and said: ²*“Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? ³ Dress for action like a man; I will question you, and you make it known to Me. ⁴ Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell Me, if you have understanding. ⁵ Who determined its measurements — surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it?*

⁶ On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone, ⁷ when the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy? ⁸ Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb, ⁹ when I made clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling band, ¹⁰ and prescribed limits for it and set bars and doors, ¹¹ and said, ‘Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stayed’?

II Corinthians 6:1–13

L The Epistle is from Second Corinthians, chapter six.

Working together with Him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ²For He says, *“In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you.”* Behold, now is the favorable



time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³We put no obstacle in anyone’s way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger;

⁶by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; ⁷by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

¹¹We have spoken freely to you, Corinthians; our heart is wide open.

¹²You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted in your own affections. ¹³In return (I speak as to children) widen your hearts also.
