


WELCOME to all guests and members; we are glad that you are here to worship with us and hope you will return often as *our friends in Christ!*











THANKSGIVING FOR LIGHT


P Blessed are You, O Lord our God, king of the universe, who led Your people Israel by a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. Enlighten our

THEME SEQUENCE

Throughout the Scriptures there are words of encouragement to look for signs of the Lord and of His coming. One of the grandest invitations to look is written by John in the first chapter of Revelation as he writes: "Grace to you and peace ... from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth. ... Behold, He is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see Him." "Every eye" includes our eyes! We are certain to see His return as we continue to look in faith. The hymn "Lo! He Comes with Clouds Descending" invites us to look for the coming of the Lord and was authored by Charles Wesley, one of the most prolific hymnwriters of the English language. Wesley, whose life spanned most of the eighteenth century, wrote over six thousand hymns, many of which are still sung today. He wrote this hymn specifically for this particular week in Advent, reminding Christians of the final coming of our Advent King in all His glory.



OLD TESTAMENT READING

Psalm 80

■ The Old Testament Reading for our Midweek Advent Service is from Psalm 80.
Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel,

you who lead Joseph like a flock.

You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth.

The mountains were covered with its shade, the mighty cedars with its branches.

It sent out its branches to the sea and its shoots to the River.

Why then have you broken down its walls,

so that all who pass along the way pluck its fruit?

The boar from the forest ravages it,

and all that move in the field feed on it.

Turn again, O God of hosts!

Look down from heaven, and see;

have regard for this vine,

the stock that your right hand planted,

and for the son whom you made strong for yourself.

They have burned it with fire; they have cut it down; may they perish at the rebuke of your face!

But let your hand be on the man of your right hand,

Let your face shine, that we may be saved!



- **©** But now in these last days, He has spoken to us by His Son.




Sin's debt, that fearful burden,


