

At times, it seems there are very few things in this world that we can count on; and that, in part, because everything is changing, and changing unpredictably, erratically, and in ways that are less than helpful. We yearn from something greater—something more stable. "...Earth's joys grow dim, its glories pass away; change and decay in all around I see; O Thou who changest not, abide with me." {LSB 878 stz. 4} The Lord does not change! He continues to condemn sin, but His mercy also endures forever. Because the Lord, in mercy, refrained from doing what He had every right to do (punishing us with consuming wrath), we have yet another reason to Return to the Lord: He does not change — His mercy abides.



#### **PASSION INTRODUCTION**

The fourth section of the Passion Narrative taken from the four Gospels starts in the hall of judgment. It is here that we meet Pontius Pilate, a name so familiar to us because we speak it as part of the Creed. We also meet Herod and hear of the release of the notorious prisoner Barabbas. In a meaningful moment, Barabbas is set free and Jesus bears the punishment of the crowd, which is agitated by the chief priests and elders of the people. Jesus takes the punishment at that moment, just as He will take the punishment that pays the price of our sins at the cross.

To prepare for the hearing of this week's narrative section, we sing the hymn "My Song Is Love Unknown." Although the text is relatively new to usage in Lutheran hymnals, the words are from a poem written by English clergyman Samuel Crossman in 1664. One of the British king's royal chaplains, Samuel Crossman used his ability with words to capture a deep devotional feeling that is as meaningful in the twenty-first century as it was when first written in the middle of the seventeenth century.


In life no house, no home

**HYMN OF THE DAY** "A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth"



## PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

- Remind them of our Savior, who overcame death and the grave and rose on the third day. Use the skills You have placed within medical professionals and counselors of all sorts to show Your love, unknown to them in their present hour.
- P O Thou who changest not, we turn to You, praying for those who have strayed from the family of faith.
- © Open their ears to hear You calling them home. Surround them with people to speak Your Word and demonstrate Your care. May they ponder anew what the Almighty can do.
- P O Holy Spirit, we turn to You who tires not in inviting us to return, praying for all who are burdened with guilt or shame.
- Remind them that it is the Savior who calls; let every ear hear and respond, confessing their sins in the sure hope of gracious forgiveness.
- P Lord Jesus, You returned to Jerusalem, passionate in Your mission to show mercy and love.
- Give us confident faith at every reception of Your body and blood in the Lord's Supper. Gather us as a hen gathers her chicks that the whole Church may rejoice together under Your eternal protection.
- P O Word of God Incarnate, You were sent by the Father to do His will.
- We give thanks that by Your obedient death and resurrection You returned to Him, having accomplished Your mission and offering pardon to all who bring their requests to Him in Your Name.
- P These and any other things You would have us ask of You, heavenly Father, grant to us for the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, in whose Name we pray; together:

#### LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.


