He began his studies for the Holy Ministry at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, IN, in the fall of 1986. He did field work at St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Fort

Wayne, and served his vicarage year at St. John's Lutheran Church in Yankton, SD. He served there for twelve years before accepting the call to be Pastor here at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Danville, IL the summer of 2012.


