Immanuel Messenger

"For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths." - 2 Timothy 4:3-4

The more I read these words of caution from Paul to Timothy, the more I see them coming into their fulfillment in our day and age. If you just take a look around at all of the ideologies that have pervaded our culture, even in just this past year, it is hard to read these words and not consider them to be, at least, prophetic if not truly inspired words as from God Himself! In a culture where a person can be "cancelled" for the crime of thinking or speaking wrongly in public or on social media, it certainly seems as though Paul had a few insights into what life would look like nearly 2000 years after he wrote these words to a young pastor, doesn't it?

While these words serve as a good reminder for any pastor, young or old, they also give a sense of hope and comfort for the Church. Certainly, we all know that the Word that is proclaimed from our pulpits and throughout our services is not one that is very well accepted in and by the world. We've seen other church bodies cave to the demands of society to be "more inclusive" as our nearest neighbors (the ELCA) have fully embraced the homosexual and "trans-rights" movements and agendas. All in a vain attempt to become more appealing to the masses and cater to the "woke" ideologies of the sinners who demand that the teachings of the Church match the desires of their hearts.

But the reality is that any Church that dares to cling firmly to the truth that is laid out in Scripture, God's Holy Word, will never be embraced by the world. Any Church who declares the words that God Himself declared to His people through the prophet Isaiah, "I am the Lord, there is no other, besides me there is no God" will be labeled as close-minded and bigoted for not "being open" to other worldviews. So we have seen Paul's warning become our reality as our society, and world as a whole, embraces the gods of the world as they sacrifice their unborn children to the god of fortune and fame, the god of government as they fear love and trust in it above all others, and the god of self as they cater to the whims and fancies of the flesh and demand that everyone else embrace and celebrate their "diversity".

It certainly seems like we have found ourselves stuck between a rock and a hard place, doesn't it? Yet, as our Lord always does, there are promises of hope for the Lord's Church. Paul reminds Timothy, "As for you, always be soberminded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry...Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing" (2 Tim. 4:5,8). This is the great hope and promise that we, as the Lord's people have clung to for literally generations. The promise that, though this life would be challenging, and though the Church will face her own fair share of trials and tribulations, each of us who stand firm in faith have a crown of righteousness laid up for us that will be given us on that day when we draw our final breath. Indeed, as we are called to fight the good fight of faith, we fight it knowing that the war against our enemies of the devil, the world, and our own sinful flesh has already been won in the death of our Lord Jesus Christ! His death is the great hope to which we cling, the great joy upon which our faith and hope is firmly built!

So, we fight the good fight with confidence. For we know that, as Paul reminds the Church in Rome, "For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39). So, fear not, dear Christian, and falter not in your proclamation of the Good News of Him who died for sin and rose again victorious over death and the grave! Proclaim, loudly and proudly in word and in deed, the great mercies of your Lord and Savior which are new every morning! Rest in the comfort that He gives you, knowing that no matter what this life and world throw at you, He has overcome them for you, so that you may rest peacefully in the loving arms of your Father who cares for you, nurtures you, and sustains you day by day, your whole lives through!

CHRISTIAN SYMBOL: The butterfly symbolizes resurrection, Easter and the new life we have in Christ Jesus. As a caterpillar disappears into a chrysalis, so Jesus' dead body was hidden in a tomb. The emergence of the butterfly, rising into the sky in its beautiful new body, reminds us of Christ's resurrection — and ours.



CAPITAL FUND DRIVE: Our current bank balance is \$15,185 which includes the Honey Sunday, Chili-to-go, Valentine's Day bake sale, PI day, and Super Bowl subs fundraisers (\$1,117.50) and Christmas tree gifts of \$3,780. Our current projects are replacing the school guttering and completely redoing the north portion of the parking lot. The school guttering appears to be the original guttering when the school was built in the early 1950's and is leaking very badly. This is special 8" guttering which we will replace with 8" seamless aluminum gutters. We have an estimate from a local general contractor for the gutters of \$16,833, and we will get the project rebid when we have the money. There is a thermometer in the narthex showing this goal and the money we have towards it. The north portion of the parking lot has deteriorated to the point that it cannot be repaired and must be milled up and replaced from the base up. There is a Capital Fund Drive bulletin board in the hallway between the coat room and the parish mailboxes. Prior generations worked and sacrificed to build the school/church building, and it is up to us to preserve and improve our church home just as we would our own household's. All donations from large to small are equally appreciated. If you have any questions, please contact Jo Van Hoveln or any of the committee members. Our next meeting is Apr. 29, at 6 pm. for the Capital Fund Drive combined with a recap meeting to discuss the results of the Pork Loin Carryout Dinner.

GRILLED PORK LOIN DINNER: The Capital

Fund is hosting a drive through meal on Sat., **Apr. 24** from 4:30 to 6 pm. The menu is grilled pork loin, baked potato, green beans, Italian bread, and lemon streusel cake. The tickets are on sale now before and after each church service and in the church office during the week. Tickets must be purchased in advance. Our goal is to sell 75 tickets by Apr. 11. If we are unable to meet that goal, the event will be cancelled and tickets refunded. Please stop by the table in the chapel hallway to

The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- ¹/₂ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 cup melted butter
- ¹/₄ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
- 2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
- 3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
- 4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
- As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center – just like Jesus' empty tomb!
