

A Message from Pastor Callahan

August 2019

Dear Friends of Immanuel,

"When they came, [Samuel] looked on Eliab and thought, 'Surely the LORD's anointed is before him.' But the LORD said to Samuel, 'Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks on the heart." - 1 Samuel 16:6-7

First, a little background is in order for our reading is in order. This reading comes from a time in Israel's history when things were a little tumultuous. Their king, Saul, had abandoned the LORD. Since Saul had turned his back on the commands of the LORD, the Lord called His prophet, Samuel, to go and anointed another to take Saul's place. Such are the circumstances surrounding this reading from Scripture.

I share this reading with you because when I first read it for one of my recent morning devotions I was a little frightened. I was struck by the last words of verse 7, "the LORD looks on the heart". Now, certainly the LORD was making a point to Samuel in this conversation. Saul had been of great stature, and by all outward appearances he was a wonderful man to be chosen for the task of leading Israel, yet in his heart he ended up being corrupted and evil, abandoning the LORD who had called him and placed him upon the throne. So the LORD's point is well taken. We ought not, as the saying goes, judge a book by its cover". But that is so hard not to do. First impressions, studies have shown, have a lasting effect. Whether those impressions are good or bad, they can be hard to shake, and so it is natural for us to make judgments on situations, places, or people based off of the facts that we see and the impressions they make upon us.

On the other end, we can use this knowledge to manipulate those around us, and sometimes we do just that. We can make all the right people think we are kind, and generous, and hard-working while we are really all of the things Luther calls us to

think of in his short form of confession, "Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you been hot-tempered, rude, or quarrelsome? Have you hurt someone by your words or deeds? Have vou stolen, been negligent, wasted anything, or done any harm?" The reason the words from our reading from 1 Samuel can be so terrifying is that, though we may be able to hide our fiendish thoughts and evil inclinations from our neighbors, the LORD does not see as man sees. He looks at the heart. And we all remember what Jesus says about the heart, don't we? "For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person." We cannot hide our sin or sinful nature from the LORD, no matter how much we might like to think we can, or how hard we might try.

But the blessing of this passage from Scripture is that, though the LORD does see our hearts for what they are; sinful, contemptable, and corrupted, His love for us continues on unabated. It is exactly for those reasons that He sent His Son to take on our human flesh, bear our sin upon the cross, and die the death that we have earned for ourselves. Though we are sinners through and through, our Lord continues to call us by name to come to Him, repent of our sin, and hear the blessed proclamation that, in Christ, our sins have been forgiven. When we hear the Word of God calling us to Himself and forgiving our sins, and we spend time in His Word through prayer and meditation, our hearts will turn from hearts that love sin to hearts that love Him! May your hearts be filled with His Word and love, and may your faith bear much fruit as you live as His forgiven and redeemed children!

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO – AND FOR – YOU! Birthdays are unique because they celebrate who someone is, not what they've done. Henri Nouwen wrote, "It is more important to celebrate a birthday than a successful exam, a promotion or a victory. Because to celebrate a birthday means to say to someone, 'Thank you for being you.' ... On a birthday we do not say, 'Thanks for what you did, or said, or accomplished.' No, we say, 'Thank you for being born and being among us. "To rejoice over someone purely for who they are is an echo of God's joy over us. Some families celebrate "baptism birthdays" (anniversaries) by lighting candles, sharing scripture and prayer, perhaps looking at photos and recounting stories of that milestone event that marked the beginning of their faith life. On a birthday, said Nouwen, "we lift someone up and let everyone say, 'We love you.'" In baptism, God lifts us to his very heart and declares, "You are my precious child. I love you."

BOARD OF DIRECTORS SUMMARY:

- Board members continue to discuss appropriate steps for final dissolution of Danville Lutheran School.
- Board continues to discuss the future of Christian education with developing Immanuel Lutheran School. An updated report was given by Gail Garner.
- Board approved Sam Van Camp as Director of Finance and Cindy Pasquale and Pam West to finance board.
- Updated version of Immanuel Lutheran Church Constitution By-Laws reviewed and discussed. Vote for approval to present to congregation will be in the near future.
- Pastoral call committee update: Surveys mailed to congregation for their input. Once surveys are compiled the next step is to go to the district with list. Target date is July 30.
- Board of Properties: School floors close to completion and window project is ongoing. Recognition of appreciation for Jerry Kennett, Denny Hilton, and Gary Stuhr for their time and help with properties.

GIFT (SCRIP) CARDS: There will not be a Scrip order in August. The next Scrip card order is due to the church office by 1 pm on **Sept. 9**. *How does this help Immanuel?* Each vendor gives us a percentage of the face value of the gift card which is our profit. This rate depends on the vendor and ranges anywhere from 1.5 - 14%. Right now this provides \$700 - \$1,000 of income annually for the church, but it could be much more if more people utilized this opportunity! Most of the local fast food/chain restaurants (with varying rates of profit), plus Meijer, Kohl's, Wal-Mart, and Big R have cards available *every Sunday* and in the office during the week.

CAPITAL FUND DRIVE COMMITTEE: We have \$18,800 already saved for the next west side classroom window phase. So far this year, fundraisers for the west windows (Super Bowl Subs, Valentine's sweets, PI day, rummage sale, 5 soup suppers, Men's Club Taste of Deutschland, Kohl's Cares Workday at the church, and the concession at Danville Dans games) have raised \$8,744! Thank you to everyone involved in making those fundraisers successful! The next phase will be the windows for the two west side classrooms, the music room and the cafeteria which will be \$26,960. The music room curtains move when it's breezy! These new windows will also help lower our heating and air conditioning bills since they are energy efficient. If you or a group of members would like to sponsor a window by raising the money for it, please contact Jo Van Hoveln or Wayne Mann. Prior generations worked and sacrificed to build the school/church building, and it is up to us to preserve and improve our church home just as we would our own household's. There is a cost breakdown for the windows on the Capital Fund bulletin board (between the mailboxes and the coat room); please stop by and check it out. It's not too late to donate to the Capital Fund Drive. All donations from small to large are equally appreciated. Envelopes for this purpose are on the ushers' desk and the Capital Fund Drive bulletin board between the mailboxes and the coat room. If you have any questions, please contact Jo Van Hoveln. Our next meeting is Aug. 8 at 6:30 pm. Members of the congregation are welcome to join us for this meeting.
