# "Let Our Gladness Banish Sadness"

Dear Friends of Immanuel,

Almost anyone surveyed would state that Christmas is the most wonderful time of the year; and

yet ... the bumps and grinds of life often leave people rather glum, or even *blue* this time of year. One of the NEW hymns in our hymnal stands out as an encouragement to "*Let Our Gladness Banish Sadness*"! {LSB 371}

First, please know: we're not pretending that a hymn can make a grieving person happy with glee or giddiness; no way! Nor should it! Nor should we want it to!! No, this hymn, like the Nativity Gospel, is not about a mere emotion; it is about much more!

Second, I, for one, look forward to a Children's Nativity program built on this hymn—it would sound awesome sung by a children's ensemble or solo!

The tune is a sweet, flowing tune called Bohemian (not Rhapsody!).

Sing the first stanza! The opening line lets us know it's not about one's personal emotion, it is about the message that banishes the sadness of all creation!

(i.e. sin) God loved (favored) the world so much that He gave His eternal Son, born in a stall, to banish the sadness of sin. Yes, that baby in the manger

is the Lord of all. The Lord—the one bigger than all your problems and sorrows. This is why all our best Christmas traditions and practices lead us to the manger.

Sing the second stanza! The birth of Jesus was the most anticipated and expected event ever! The heavenly host of angels had the joyous honor of announcing that the time had come for Jesus to be born – just as was promised. And the angels sang the message not to the elite of society, but to the humble shepherds (the outcasts of society; the *throw-away* people). Note the emphasis that we today have the great honor of joining the angels in telling the good news of Jesus to others!

Sing the third (*the final*) stanza! *Child appealing*, this is the One who would draw all men unto Himself when He was lifted up from the earth (cross). Yes, Jesus is the One who brings true Light and lasting

pleasure (eternal life in heaven)—and don't ya just love how He is called Mary's Son and Heaven's gift and treasure (a vivid expression for True Man and True God in One Person)! Yet this almighty, all-powerful God chooses to call us 'friend' (see John 15) and *bends near* to dwell and abide with us, God with us! He comes bringing blessings that will embrace and caress us forevermore!

The reality is that we walk through the valley of the shadow of death; and singing a hymn won't take our grief away; but the joy sung by angels at Jesus birth, to which we join our voices, reminds that the good Lord is truly with us – God with us – every step of that valley, leading us to the manger ...and to heaven!

in a royal palace. Then, directed to Bethlehem, the wise men found a sight so utterly out of keeping with a king — a poor young woman and child, in a poor hut —

that one might expect them to head straight home. "But," declares Luther, "with a great, strong and full faith they ... follow the word of the prophet and the witness of the star in all purity of heart," bowing to worship and honor the Savior.



# **January 2019**

## Mrs. Connie Marxman-Preschool 3/4

After Christmas break, we are going to get more involved with indoor and outdoor science activities. We are going to turn on our observation skills, critical thinking skills, and experimenting skills by exploring more of our natural environment. These science experiments encourage exploring with our senses. We will use sight, sound, touch, smell, and sometimes even taste during hands-on, visually engaging play opportunities! During Jesus morning devotions, we look at how Jesus grew in age and height, just like us. He learned from God's word, just like us and He used that knowledge to tell how much God loves everyone; just like us!

### Mrs. Tabby Hammer-Preschool 3/4

The preschool class will be learning about the winter season and snow after Christmas. We will be able to answer the following questions by the end of January: What causes it to snow? # SPECIAL SCIENCE EDITION

Mrs. Penny Tibben-Grades 3/4

Science is a subject both third and fourth graders share jointly. They have examined a variety of natural resources and studied the layers of soil. After looking at the importance of water, Aqua Illinois was the recipient of our written paragraphs of thanks for water purification. Both grades will now be looking at the impact they have on their environment and how those resources God has given us can be used more wisely to serve one another. New Year's greetings from grades three and four!

Mr. Dan Yagow-Grades 5/6

In science class, we have recently learned and applied Newton's first three laws of motion: 1) inertia, 2) acceleration, and 3) action-reaction. These laws required our understanding of speed, velocity, acceleration, momentum, friction, and gravity. Several students succeeded in launching a balloon rocket that went nearly fifty feet demonstrating the Third Law of Newton action-reaction. Every student was successful in pulling a paper out from under a stack of quarters to prove the

First Law of Newton inertia. In the month ahead, we will be shifting to earth science beginning with the rock cycle and the processes that change rocks. Later in the month, we will move to fossils. Here we will interpret the layers of the earth from a Biblical worldview and make application of the fossil graveyard we have today as left behind by the Great Flood in Genesis. Mrs. Kim Wright -Junior High

In January, grades 7/8 take an in-depth look at the cell cycle, mitosis, and the modern usage of stem cells. How should Christians view stem cell research? Students will master unit concepts using Powerpoints, digital interactives, creating mitosis cycle flipbooks, taking notes, constructing what we call "flashbooks", and lab activities. During the unit, students will grow bacteria from swabs taken around the school building, follow a viral outbreak to its source, and test the effect of disinfectants on bacterial growth. We look forward to a new calendar year and the blessings God gives to each of us.

# KINDERGARTEN

Mrs. Marah Showers Our New Year will begin with a science unit on hibernation. We will be learning about which animals hibernate, where they go, and why they do so. This unit will introduce a multitude of new vocabulary words, and also allow us to do different experiments on conserving energy heartbeat, and body temperature. When we finish up our hibernation unit, it will lead us right into our unit on weather and seasons. Our kindergarten class wishes everyone a blessed new year for 2019!

First graders are so excited to learn about the solar system! The first graders will learn all about astronauts and how they survive in outer space. We will even get a chance to write to an astronaut. After we learn about our solar system, we will come back to earth and explore natural resources.
