

As Christians we are to honor, respect, and obey those in authority over us. Our Lord Jesus teaches us at His Ascension that "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Mt 28:18). Our God is the source of all authority, and therefore we are to follow them. Martin Luther teaches this in the meaning of the Fourth Commandment where we confess that "We should fear and love God, and so we should not despise our parents and superiors, nor provoke them to anger, but honor, serve, obey, love, and esteem them." Yet, in his treatises "To the Christian Nobility" and "Against the Peasants" Luther writes on what Christians should do when a government demands us to violate God's Word and/or our conscience. Then we ought to speak out for as Luther himself said at the Diet of Worms, to violate one's conscience is neither safe nor right.

Unfortunately, in today's world there seems to be more of these times where we need to take a stand for what God's Word clearly and plainly teaches. The bill (SB818) which Governor Pritzker signed into law last fall is one instance where we as Christians need to speak out. Sexual education needs to be taught to our children, but it needs to be taught in accordance with the 6th Commandment and the rest of our theology. This new curriculum aligns with the National Sex Education Standards (NSES). These standards include teaching things such as LGBTQ and gender identity. These two concepts are anti-biblical and indeed sinful. In Genesis 2 God established marriage and a healthy physical relationship in His perfect creation. He did so as He made Adam and Eve, male and female, and joined them together, giving them the command to be fruitful and multiply.

LGBTQ relationships fall outside of these bounds and therefore, are sinful. To teach them to our children is not to be tolerated. Likewise, a good theology of man reveals that our Heavenly Father has made us in His image, both male and female. We confess in the creed that God has made us and all creatures, and that he has given us our *"body and soul, eyes, ears, and all our members"*. Therefore, we are to respect our bodies and treat them well as the gift from God that they are.

The new NSES are required in all schools and its curriculum begins in kindergarten. So what do we as parents need to do? Firstly, thank God for Christian education. Private institutions are, for now, exempt and not required to follow the NSES. There are two options to help shield our children from these lies. The first option is Christian education. There are a few Christian grade schools in town, and if one desires home schooling the Wittenberg Academy is an excellent choice. Understandably, a parochial school is not an option for every family or every child. In my own life my low vision played a part in my college selection and to a lesser extent my high school as well. If your child is enrolled in public schools, you as the parent have the choice to OPT OUT. Normally this can be done through a simple letter to your school. If you wish to opt out, and as your pastor and theologian I encourage you to, and would like help navigating this unfortunate new frontier, please feel free to contact me. I am here to help. This is an important issue in the raising and education of our youth and it has the church's attention and concern.

The pilot was able to land and then safely deliver the sick child to an Anchorage hospital. The airlift service praised the residents' determination, but Nelson describes their effort as "normal" and "ordinary." What everyday actions can you use to provide light amid darkness? How can you shine Jesus' light in a world that needs him?

ORGAN FUND: As reported at the last Voters Meeting, the Board of Directors recently established a policy on allocating any bequests received by the congregation that did not have a specific designation for the gift. That policy includes 25% of those contributions being set aside in an organ fund.

You may be asking, "Didn't we just get a new organ?" Well, yes and no.

Our original Wicks pipe organ was installed in 1977, five years after the sanctuary was dedicated. But as with most things from that era, the electronic controls needed attending, with an estimate of over \$30,000 for that work.

Thanks to a generous donation, we received a Rodgers 950 digital organ in 2013, with the congregation paying under \$18,000 to have the digital organ work with our pipes. But, Immanuel is the third location for this organ. The original church it was in had a lightning strike, but it was believed the organ had no damage. When that church got a new organ, the dealers took this console, replaced all the circuit boards. It was sold to an individual who had it in their home in Louisiana, before coming to Immanuel.

Since its installation here, the organ endured a power surge which damage some of the components that were replaced. Then a lightning strike in 2015 caused damage to the electronic components, which were replaced with a \$25,000 insurance claim.

In the following years, we have had intermitted "noises" when the organ is used, with the majority occurring around Easter – the organ has not been used through the entire Easter morning services for the last five years. But then it seems to work fine after that.

Some of the early problems with the organ were with the controls that communicated with the pipes. So they have been disconnected and not used since May 2017.

Unfortunately, Rodgers has not manufactured new parts for this organ model in more than 20 years. Any components we replace are going to start out 20 years old.

To get a comparable replacement for the organ we currently have, and be able to incorporate the pipes, it will be near \$150,000 as of the last time I talked to the technicians. And as we know now with electronic chips for cars, trucks and computers, that price will probably be higher.

We're not proposing to make a change immediately, we wanted to set up a mechanism to be prepared for the future. That is why the decision was made to establish an Organ fund. We are not actively seeking donations at this time, but you may feel free to contribute to it if you so desire. Feel free to visit with me about this if you have any questions. —*Tom Fricke*

CID Board of Directors' Meeting Summary

The Board of Directors met at the district office Nov. 23.

1st Vice President Rev. Rick Milas has retired and moved away from the district, so it was necessary that he resign his position. 2nd VP Rev. Mark Eddy is now the 1st VP. Rev. Michael Mohr, having received the second highest number of votes at the convention, succeeds Rev. Milas as the Eastern Region VP and is ordered as the 2nd VP. This required Rev. James Stunkel to move from Assistant Secretary to Secretary.

President Miller provided updates on the 19 vacancies in the district. Rev. Doug Minton has been appointed as the Iroquois Circuit Visitor to succeed Rev. Tim Hahn, who accepted a call outside of the district.

Trip Rodgers shared information regarding Senate Bill 818, a comprehensive and aggressive sex education program so that parents in congregations can know what non-Biblical views the state will be requiring of public-school education. Plans continue for various youth groups to attend either the National Youth Gathering or Higher Things conferences this summer. Plans are also in the works for the 2022 District Bible Bowl.

Rev. Dr. Ken Schurb shared news from Financial Secretary Jim Frazee that YTD giving is within \$600 (4/100 of 1%) of the anticipated income from congregations, the closest we have been in many years.

As financial reports were reviewed, Treasurer Dale Dirks noted expenditures were not as high as anticipated, so the financial picture is even better than anticipated.

Following a thorough review, the Board of Directors passed a tentative budget of \$1.9 million in anticipated expenses over against \$1.8 million in anticipated income (not counting pass-through items like National Youth Gathering funds) and roughly \$500k in reserves and cashon-hand to make a budget balanced.

CAPITAL FUND DRIVE: There is a correction to the summary of projects we have completed; the school guttering completed in 2021 for \$13,835 was omitted in last month's article. We have completed most of our parsonage updates with just a few additional things that we are planning to do in January. The current bank balance is \$11,540. The congregation established the Capital Fund Drive in 2012, and thanks to our generous congregation, we have accomplished many needed upgrades and renovations. Prior generations worked and sacrificed to build the school and church building, and it is up to us to preserve and improve our church home just as we would our own household's. There is a list of projects completed and the costs on the Capital Fund bulletin board (between the mailboxes and the coat room); please stop by and check it out. Our next meeting is Tuesday, Jan. 25 at 6:30 pm. This meeting is mainly a short update on the capital fund projects and discussion of our next fundraising event in late April.

The *Capital Fund Christmas Tree* in the narthex will stay up until Epiphany for anyone who wishes to donate to help build up our bank account for future projects. *Thank you to all who have already donated!* The results will be reported in future Immanuel Lights and the February newsletter.

2022 ENVELOPES have been distributed. Please use your new envelopes now; do not use leftover 2021 envelopes after Jan. 1 as your number may have changed. This will help us accurately acknowledge your contributions. If you currently do not have envelopes, but would like to begin using them, please call Kim in the church office. Thanks!
