

Dear Friends of Immanuel,

"For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

- Romans 8:38-39

In my short tenure as the vacancy pastor for Immanuel I have, or will have, officiated five funerals for members who have died. In a time when the church is accosted with acts of violence against her members (remember the Easter celebration mass murder in Sri Lanka?), when her enemies surround her on all sides, and it seems as though the world is devolving further and further into mass chaos, we may be tempted to wonder to ourselves, "How will we ever survive?" It is tempting to look around and, seeing friends and loved ones dying, wonder to ourselves how the church will weather the storm. It is tempting to want to acquiesce to the demands of the world that we be more tolerant, more accepting, and more lenient in our doctrine and practice so that we would be able to see increases in our membership rather than continual decreases.

But it is in times like these that remind me why our Lutheran hymnody is so important. LSB 645, "Built on the Rock" speaks to this very situation that the church faces in our own day and age. Written over 200 years ago, in this hymn we sing these beautiful words: "Built on the Rock the Church shall stand even when steeples are falling. Crumbled have spires in every land; bells still are chiming and calling, calling the young and old to rest, but most of all the souls distressed, longing for rest everlasting." The author goes on to remind us that no matter what happens to the church on earth, the Church will always prevail. Why? Because of the means of grace! "Here stands the font before our eyes, telling how God has received us. The altar recalls Christ's sacrifice and what Hs Supper here gives us. Here sound the Scriptures that proclaim Christ yesterday, today, the same, and evermore our Redeemer."

The Church lives on because Christ is her Bridegroom, her Head, and He is <u>living</u>! That is the point of the empty tomb, isn't it? Recall the words of the angels on that Easter morning, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen" (Lk. 24:5b-6a). <u>This</u> is the reason for our Easter proclamation, "Alleluia, Christ <u>is</u> risen!", but it also the reason for Paul's words of comfort to the Church in Rome and the Church today. Because Christ lives, <u>nothing</u> will be able to separate us from the love that God has for us. Because Jesus died for our sins and paid their debt in full, even when we die, we are victorious! When our hope is built on the Rock of Christ, nothing will ever prevail against I, not even the gates of hell.

Moreover, we have been given the means of grace, the very tokens of our Lord's boundless and ceaseless love for His Church. Each and every week you come into His presence, receive the promise that your sins have been forgiven, hear the proclamation of His Word, and remember your baptism. You come to His table, regularly, to feast at a banquet like none other. You come, invited as dear children of the Heavenly Father to receive blessings the world cannot give. So rest assured, dear brothers and sisters in Christ, that the Church will prevail. She will remain. She will continue calling, preaching, and teaching no matter what the devil or the world throws at her.

Right now this provides \$700 - \$1,000 of income annually for the church, but it could be much more if more people utilized this opportunity! Order forms are on the information table. Orders are not limited to the vendors listed on the order blank; a full vendor list is on the hall bulletin board. Write the name of the vendor, denomination of the gift card, number of cards wanted, and total amount on a blank line of the order form. Most of the local fast food/chain restaurants (with varying rates of profit), plus Meijer, Kohl's, Wal-Mart, and Big R have cards available every Sunday and in the office during the week.

"Moving four hours away from home to come to Western four years ago was a very hard challenge for me," said Emma as she was graduating recently from Western Illinois University. "Moving to somewhere where I knew no one was my worst nightmare as a shy freshman girl. I thought that everything would be different."

"But I quickly found that at least one thing would remain the same," she continued. "My parents brought me that first weekend to meet Pastor [Mike] Burdick and see the Student Center. This place has given me so many other opportunities as well such as singing regularly and serving in Lutheran Student Fellowship, but that 50th anniversary service will forever be one of my favorite memories."

Overall, Emma said, "I find it fitting that my first educational setting in preschool was at an Immanuel Lutheran school, and I end my educational career (possibly) with an Immanuel Lutheran Church and Student Center. . . . I look forward to coming back and visiting as an alum."
