# "Christ the Eternal Lord"

Do you remember just a few months ago when we were still in the throes of winter? Some wondered if the cold and grav skies would ever end. The shift to Spring and Summer may have arrived seemingly late but here we are in the bright and beautiful sunshine! 🌣 These early weeks of summer bring a flurry of activity (from graduations to VBS; weddings and Friendship Sunday; Voters' meeting elections and installation; etc); but by the time we get to July the Church's calendar seems somewhat sparse. But, my friends, the Son of God is shining through the activities but also through multiple confirmation classes and personal witnessing that will fill our days in the sunshine of God's great grace and favor all summer.

Let's take a quick (*sunny*) look at yet another new hymn in our hymnal: "*Christ the Eternal Lord*"! Read through the hymn below. ...

This great new hymn (though sung to an old, familiar tune: the same tune as "*Crown Him with Many Crowns*") is a hymn that bespeaks and

inspires mission activity, i.e. us as Christians sharing Christ with those in our circles (friends, neighbors, relatives, co-workers). As we reflect on this hymn, think about the people you are going to invite to come and worship with us on (Friendship Sunday (and beyond!).

This hymn, like all good hymns, is about Christ! Look at the first phrase of each stanza for descriptions of Christ and His caring attributes and gifts that work to extend mercy to those in need through us! In the first stanza, His promises and gifts have such an impact on us as believers that we seek to serve Him by extending the knowledge of His glory to others!

In the second stanza, we find that our mission is shaped by His unchanging Word (much more than by the shifting sands of culture) so that His steadfast and reliable Word can bring the true and only source of salvation, the faith-nourishing Bread of life, to hungry souls! The third and central stanza points to the central truth that Christ came in our flesh to be our Savior and the Savior for all the world—THIS is the message we are to tell everyone everywhere!

The fourth stanza extends what we know about Christ, the unfading light, of everlasting day, our Morning Star..., the Life, the Truth, the Way; yet, He does not lord it over us but considers us His friends (remember vour friends!) that our whole life honor Christ and share Christ! Why is all this important? The fifth and final stanza assures us that the eternal Lord who ascended to heaven gives us the promise of being in that number gathered around heaven's throne singing for eternity! Oh, how we want to be in that number! And it is Christ who assures us we are! As caring friends we want our friends to be in that number also! But how will the unchurched learn of Christ unless we tell themnot lecturing, but inviting them to come and worship with us as our guests and to remain as our friends in Christ! Oh, do invite your friends to come and worship with us for Friendship Sunday (June 10) but also beyond that as our friends in Christ! God bless you and yours!



WOMEN'S GUILD NEWS: The Women's Guild met in May before breaking for the summer. We thank our guests Mike Klepp, Natalie Powell, and Bethany the Comfort Dog for their presentation on Trinity's K-9 Ministry! Although our next formal meeting will not be until September, many things will be happening throughout the summer:

- Mite collection continues the first Sunday of each month.
- Twin blanket collection for the VA continues. We have 12 blankets towards our goal of 36.
- A school kitchen spruce up will happen in July watch the Sunday bulletin for the date.
- A survey will be put in church mailboxes for input on ingatherings and meeting topics.
- Monthly support for Missionary Freeman Rohlfing in the Czech Republic continues.
- Monthly support for seminary student Jim Bartok continues.

#### **PARISH EDUCATION NEWS:**

- Thank you to all that participated in Monical's Day. A profit of \$219.13 will help with the expenses of summer VBS.
- Save the date for Rally Day Sept.23
- The last day of Sunday School is June 17 and it will resume on Aug. 19.
- The next Parish Education meeting is Aug. 20.

**GIFT (SCRIP) CARDS:** The next Scrip order is due to the church office by 1:00 pm by June 11 (for pickup June 17); and by July 9 (for pickup July 15). Each vendor gives us a percentage of the face value of the card which is our *profit*; it can vary anywhere from 1.5% to 14%. This provides an extra \$700 to \$1,000 income a year for the church, and it could be much more if more people utilized this opportunity! These cards are so much simpler than carrying cash (there's no fumbling trying to put change back in your wallet, and they are good anywhere in the USA). Order blanks are on the table in the hallway. Orders are not limited to the vendors listed on the order blank; if you want to order a vendor not listed, first see if it is available by looking it up at www.shopwithscrip.com. Click on "Quick Links" at the bottom of the page then on "Retailers List." Write the name of the vendor, denomination of the gift card, number of cards wanted, and total amount on a blank line of the order form. There is also a vendor list on the bulletin board in the chapel hallway. Most of the local fast food/chain restaurants (with varying rates of profit to the church), plus Meijer (3%), Wal-Mart (2.5%), and Big R (3%) have cards available every Sunday in the hallway and in the church office during the week.

CAPITAL FUND DRIVE COMMITTEE: Our current project is the replacement of the school windows. PRAISE GOD AND THANK YOU FOR YOUR DONATIONS. We currently have enough to do the windows of three (almost enough for 4) of the classrooms on the east side since the water infiltration problem is worse on that side. We would like to be able to replace ALL the windows on the east side this summer while we have the contractor here. That way the entire side would match and present an updated look to the public driving on Bowman. A grant has been applied for to help pay for additional windows. Arrow Glass (the contractor that did the new windows at Danville High School) has scheduled them to be done this summer. The rest of the windows will be replaced as money is available. If we have the funds to replace more windows on the east side, the contractor has said they would also replace them this summer. Right now on the east side we have unfunded: 1 classroom, 2 in the library, 1 in the science room, 1 in the principal's office and 1 in the copy room. There is a thermometer set up in the narthex by the north balcony stairs along with special envelopes for donations. These special envelopes can be put in the offering plate or turned in to the office. So far, we have received 77% of our goal (\$55,370 for the east side). There is an cost breakdown for the windows along with drawings of each type of window on the Capital Fund bulletin board; please stop by and check it out. Our new windows would look like the windows at the high school except they would not have the black glass and we would have some that open along the bottom for ventilation and emergency egress. The new windows will also help lower our heating and air conditioning bills since they are energy efficient. If you or a group of members would like to sponsor a window by raising the money for it, please contact Jo Van Hoveln or Wayne Mann. Remember, it doesn't matter whether you are pro-school or anti-school, this building needs to be maintained! Prior generations worked and sacrificed to build the school/church building, and it is up to us to preserve and improve our church home just as we would our own household's.

Our Phase 2 pledge drive (a two-year program) started in June, 2017, and it's not too late to pledge/donate to the Capital Fund Drive. All donations from small to large are equally appreciated. If you have any questions, please contact Jo Van Hoveln.

Our next meeting is Thursday, **June 14** at 6 pm. Members of the congregation are welcome to join us for this meeting!


