I pray that you would continue to receive from your new pastor what you have received from each of his predecessors; a ministry of the Word and Sacrament through which you receive none other than your Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that you will continue to come faithfully to your Lord's house, with thanksgiving on your lips, so that you might lack nothing as you await the revealing of Jesus Christ on the Last Day. For it is only here that you can, and are, be equipped, enriched, and sustained for the battles and struggles that you face daily in this world.

Finally, I want to thank you. Thank you for the generosity you've shown me and my little family during the holiday seasons that seemed to be a bit more hectic than usual. Thank you for your kindness in the hard times, especially as I mourned the loss of my grandmother this past year and even now nurse a few broken ribs. Thank you for your understanding and flexibility as we worked together diligently to make sure that the many and various services were covered and meetings were attended. Thank you, most of all, for being faithful in your reception of the Word made flesh in your ears and upon your lips. Thank you for coming to your Lord's house and receiving the gifts He loves to give you, His dear blood-bought children. Thank you for all that you have done for me, and for all that I know you will continue to do for pastor Yonkers. Thank you!

OUR WAY OUT: While in London, Timothy Merrill was intrigued that signs with arrows read WAY OUT, rather than EXIT, as they do in America. "Everywhere I went, I saw signs that showed me the WAY OUT," he writes. That made him ponder all the Bible characters who looked for a WAY OUT of predicaments. Moses looked for a WAY OUT of Egypt, Daniel certainly wanted a WAY OUT of the lions' den and countless people thought (and still think) there's no WAY OUT from their sins. "The good news of the Gospel," Merrill writes, "is that Jesus Christ is the WAY OUT! He is our exit from the messes and disasters we create. He is the exit from sin and unrighteousness. He is the WAY OUT of a life without purpose and the WAY IN to an abundant life. And the symbol of the WAY OUT is not an arrow but a cross. What a blessing to know that Jesus knows — and is the WAY OUT!"

Make a sunflower, which turns its head to follow the sun.

What you need:

- Paper plate
- Yellow marker
- Scissors
- Yarn (black and brown)

What you do:

- 1. Color the entire plate yellow.
- Around the edge, cut out an odd number of triangles. Evenly space the cuts to form flower petals.
- 3. Poke a hole in the plate's center. String black yarn through the hole and over one triangle cut. Tie a knot at the back of the plate.
- 4. Continue looping yarn through the hole and over the remaining cuts. Secure the end. The flower should look like a wagon wheel with black spokes.
- Tie the brown yarn to a black "spoke." Weave the brown yarn over and under the spokes in a circle. Continue until the sunflower has a large center. Then tie the end.
- 6. Display your craft as a reminder to follow the Son, Jesus!
