A Message from Pastor Callahan

May 2019

Dear Friends of Immanuel,

“Jesus came and stood among them and said to them ‘Peace be with you.’ When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord.” ~John 20:19b-20

I’ve always been a bit perplexed by the reaction of the disciples to the appearance of their Lord. At first, we see them huddled together in the locked room in fear of the Jewish leadership who had murdered their teacher and Lord. There they undoubtedly gathered together to consider the “what now” of their lives. Would they go back to their old vocations as tax collectors and fishermen? Would they dare continue on the path that Jesus had started them on? I cannot even begin to imagine the fear and hopelessness that those disciples felt upon seeing their friend and master die on the cross like a common criminal. His death was, for them, a fatal blow to their ministry in His name. The cross was a source of great pain and anguish for them as they recalled the agonizing and horrific death of the man they learned from and followed, and in whose Name they did great and mighty works.

Notice, in the Scripture quoted above, what it is that makes the disciples glad to see their Lord. Once Jesus “*showed them His hands and His side*” they were glad! Isn’t that interesting? The very marks of the crucifixion, the horrible and tragic death blow that was dealt to their leader, had now become a source of inspiration and gladness for them! So it is with us Christians today. For us the cross, which was once viewed simply as an instrument of torture and death used to frighten the unruly into submission, is now a great source of comfort, hope, and a symbol of eternal life! No longer does the cross, nor the death that it once represented, cause fear and trepidation in our hearts. Now we have a far greater hope. Now we have the Lord of Life,

once nailed to the tree of death, come to us bearing the marks of His crucifixion and proclaiming to us “Peace”, just as He did for the disciples in St. John’s Gospel.

But it goes even further than that. St. Paul reminds us in his letter to the church in Rome that, “*the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us... for I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus*” (Rom. 8:18, 38-39). We who have the promise of the risen Lord have the hope of eternal life to come.

I have no way of knowing what you may be going through as you read this article. It may be illness or disease, it may be a sickness you cannot seem to get rid of, it may be any of the myriads of affliction that affect the body in this life, or it may be an affliction of the soul. Whatever the case, I pray that you take heart, as the disciples did, in the wounds of your Lord Jesus Christ. Always remember that it was for you that He humbled Himself and spoke not a word in His own defense before Pilate and the Jewish leadership, for you that He suffered the shame and indignity of the cross, for you that He breathed His last and died for the sins that you commit daily. As the prophet Isaiah wrote, “*He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities; upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His wounds we are healed.*” May you find peace in the risen Lord, knowing that you who have been baptized into His death have been baptized into His resurrection. May you find peace in the reconciliation that He won for you on the cross, and may that peace be your share in this life until He calls you to be with Him in the next. Amen.

GIFT (SCRIP) CARDS: The next Scrip Card order is due to the church office by 1 pm on **May 13** and will be available for pickup **May 19**. How does this help Immanuel? Each vendor gives us a percentage of the face value of the gift card which is our profit. This rate depends on the vendor and ranges anywhere from 1.5 – 14%. Right now this provides \$700 - \$1,000 of income annually for the church, but it could be much more if more people utilized this opportunity! Order forms are on the information table. Orders are not limited to the vendors listed on the order blank; a full vendor list is on the hall bulletin board. Write the name of the vendor, denomination of the gift card, number of cards wanted, and total amount on a blank line of the order form. Most of the local fast food/chain restaurants (with varying rates of profit), plus Meijer, Kohl's, Wal-Mart, and Big R have cards available *every Sunday* and in the office during the week.

CENTRAL IL DISTRICT MISSION STORY:

"I'm singing in the choir!" a University of Illinois graduate wrote back to University Lutheran Church, Champaign. He had recently joined an LCMS congregation where he was getting involved. Had he not sung in University Lutheran's choir first, he said, he might never have considered it anywhere else.

When a campus church consists basically of students, it comes as no surprise that their involvement is needed. Getting involved while in school today, they are preparing for further service tomorrow.

University Lutheran Church and our other campus ministries regularly hear from graduates – including those who were confirmed while in college and are new to the church – about their singing in choir, helping the fellowship committee, taking part in LWML, volunteering as youth leaders and Sunday School teachers, being members of Church Councils, and serving as Elders and congregational Presidents. University Lutheran has two alumni who were married after graduation and began working in campus ministry at a local college through their new church home.

Graduates also go on to full-time church work, ranging from teaching in Lutheran schools to Lutheran universities. Eleven young men who came through University Lutheran Church now serve in the Office of the Holy Ministry. One is currently the Secretary of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

In campus ministry, one spends time with people whose stories are just beginning. Focused on Christ and taking hold of the life He gives in Word and Sacrament, they will be known as men and women who serve for the sake of the church and the world, and who do so because Christ served them and gave Himself for their salvation.

The Lord used your congregation's gifts to the Central Illinois District to put in place campus ministries like University Lutheran Church in Champaign, and to maintain these ministries down to the present and – we pray – into the future. Thank you!

CAPITAL FUND DRIVE COMMITTEE:

The school windows have been installed on the east side of the building. PRAISE GOD AND THANK YOU FOR YOUR DONATIONS! We are planning the phases for replacing the windows on the west side. We have \$9,698 already saved for the next west side phase. So far this year, fundraisers for the west windows (Super Bowl Subs, Valentine's sweets, PI day, rummage sale and 5 soup suppers) have raised \$2,644. The next phase will be the windows for the two west side classrooms, the music room and the cafeteria which will be \$26,960. The music room curtains move when it's breezy! We are hoping to have these replaced this summer. *Window history:* the windows have deteriorated over the years (over 60!), been repaired, and now need replacing. The mortar between the glass blocks is almost gone, and the caulking around the windows has become brittle. We discussed just doing the tuck pointing and caulking, and it was around \$16,000 which would not correct the entire window problem. These windows will also help lower our heating and air conditioning bills since they are energy efficient. If you or a group of members would like to sponsor a window by raising the money for it, please contact Jo Van Hovel or Wayne Mann. Prior generations worked and sacrificed to build the school/church building, and it is up to us to preserve and improve our church home just as we would our own household's. There is a cost breakdown for the windows on the Capital Fund bulletin board (between the mailboxes and the coat room); please stop by and check it out. Our Phase 2 pledge drive started in June 2017, and it's not too late to pledge/donate to the Capital Fund Drive. All donations from small to large are equally appreciated. Envelopes for this purpose are on the ushers' desk and the Capital Fund Drive bulletin board between the mailboxes and the coat room. If you have any questions, please contact Jo Van Hovel. Our next meeting is **May 23** at 6:30 pm. Members of the congregation are welcome to join us for this meeting!





“From Grief to Gladness”

Grief is a very real part of our life. Each of us to a certain extent is mourning, for various reasons. The good news is that Christ came to change our grief to gladness.

May 12 (John 10:27-28)

“The Voice of the Shepherd”






