
A Message from Pastor Callahan

May 2020



Dear Friends of Immanuel,

There certainly is a lot of "stillness" in our world these days, isn't there? There is much less traffic on the roads, many fewer people walking the streets, and far fewer businesses for Americans to patronize in the midst of the global pandemic in which we find ourselves. But perhaps there is not quite as much stillness in our own hearts and minds. Perhaps, upon reading this, you are living with the fear of what an ongoing extension of these lockdown measures will mean for your small business. Maybe you are worried about the fixed income on which you depend being cut off because of an economic meltdown. Maybe you are concerned about the unalienable rights we as Americans are promised slowly being eroded right before your very eyes. Whatever the case may be, I think it safe to say that very many of us do not feel a stillness in our hearts and minds these days.

But this admonition from the Lord comes in the midst of a Psalm that I think is very apropos for us in our own day and age. Even if you have never read this psalm before, it is a psalm that you know well, because it is the basis for Luther's hymn "A Mighty Fortress". While I will not rehash the words of that beloved hymn here today, I would point each of you to this psalm, especially in these days of great tumult, in order to see what our Lord has to say to each of us in our time of fear and worry.

This psalm is full of terrifying images; the earth giving way, mountains being moved into the heart of the sea, waters roaring and foaming, mountains trembling at their swelling, nations raging and kingdoms tottering. These are images that strike fear into those who read these words and take them seriously, and they tell us a few important things about this life and our God. These words remind us that these terrible and terrifying things will take place. That is the truth of living in a sin

filled and fallen world. We will not be able to escape the wars, tumults, illnesses, and pandemics that can, and so often do, wreak havoc on our world and lives. But in the midst of it all, the Psalmist gives us a glimpse of the stillness and calmness that we as Christians have in this crazy, topsy-turvy world. "There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns. The nations rage, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress." (Psalm 46:4-7)

In this world that is so full of terror and tragedy, unknown and unseen enemies that take our livelihoods, comforts, and even our lives, we have a God who stands in the midst of it all, calling us to hear His voice, rejoice and be glad! Our God is the Mighty Fortress about which Dr. Luther speaks, because He stands around us, guarding and protecting us from the assaults of the sin, death, and the devil. He wraps us in His arms through the waters of Holy Baptism, brands us as His own, and promises that He has won for us the victory over our enemies of the devil, the world, and our own sinful flesh.

Our Lord does not just tell us to be still, but He gives us <u>reason</u> to be still. Because we know that He is our God, our hearts and minds are stilled by His grace and mercy. We are called to put aside the cares and worries of this world and hear the voice of our Good Shepherd, who calls us, leads us, and guides us to paths of Living Water, where He feeds us through His Word and Sacrament for the nourishment of our bodies and souls. We can be still, because our Savior, Jesus Christ, is risen from the dead! Because He lives, we also shall live.

I love the refrain, repeated twice in this psalm, "The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress." The Lord who created the heavens and the earth, for that is what the term "hosts" means, never leaves us to fend for ourselves. He continues to provide for us, care for our needs of body and soul, and forgive our sins when we err and fall away from Him. He continues to be our solid foundation, our Mighty Fortress, in the good times as well as the bad, so that those who live in Him might have the ability to be still, because we know the promise that He is our God, and He will never leave us nor forsake us. May your hearts be uplifted, your spirits strengthened, and your souls nourished as you spend time in the Word receiving the peace that surpasses all understanding. May the Lord of hosts continue to bless and preserve you until we are able to meet again!

Luther also noted: "At home, in my own house, there is no warmth or vigor in me, but in the church when the multitude is gathered together, a fire is kindled in my heart and it breaks its way through." So this summer, spend time in nature but don't neglect "to meet together" (see Hebrews 10:25)!

CID LWML MITE BYTES: Mission Grant #10 Providing "Connect to Disciple" Workshops - \$7,500

This grant will enable the CID to provide facilitators for "Connect to Disciple" outreach workshops in a total of 23 churches in 2019 – 2021. This congregational workshop is a part of a series of revitalization workshops made available by the Synod's Office of National Mission. Approximately 87% of CID churches have plateaued and/or are declining in overall membership. CID congregations need revitalization work. Dear ILS Families,

We would like to thank you for your patience and understanding during these unprecedented times. First and foremost we hope that all of you are healthy and safe.

There are some questions that need to be answered regarding the remainder of the school year. First, several of you have asked about tuition. The teachers have continued to serve the students with lessons and activities that you can cover at home while "sheltering in place". We are responsible for the teachers' salaries for the remainder of the school year and thus must continue to collect tuition in order to fulfill our obligation. Even though other private schools are charging full tuition during the pandemic, we will be reducing tuition by 25% for April and May in order to help out our families as much as possible. Please send your tuition payments to ILS as soon as possible so that Mrs. Wells can deposit them. Our mailing address is 1930 N. Bowman, Danville, Illinois, 61832.

School will officially end on Wednesday, May 20. We will be holding a drop off and pick up from 4-6 p.m. at the north cafeteria entrance. Please pull up to the entrance and a staff member will bring out your child's supplies and personal belongings. They will also pick up any materials or text books from you that need to be returned to ILS. It is not the end of the year party we had planned but it is the safest way to take care of closing details.

We also need to know if you plan to attend ILS next fall. With school being closed by the Governor in early March all of our preregistration plans have gone awry. To date we have 21 students registered for next year. It is important that we have a better handle on enrollment so that we can effectively plan for the future. At this time ILS will be a preschool, early learning center next year as we have not had enough interest in the elementary grades to continue to offer classes. Please email either Mrs. Wells or Mr. Garner if you are planning on attending ILS next fall and have not preregistered at this time.

It is still our intention to offer Summer Camp for the months of June and July. The staff is in place and excited to work with the children again. Of course, this is contingent upon the Governor allowing us to open by then. Again, please email either Mrs. Wells or Mr. Garner if you are planning on attending ILS summer camp for ages 3 through 10.

Thank you again for your patience and understanding during these unusual times. All of us at ILS will continue to hold up all of our families in prayer as we navigate the uncharted waters. We miss the children and families, our lives seem less bright without your smiles and laughter. Please take care of yourselves and we will see you next fall when life gets back to normal.







Make this cute puppet to show and tell the amazing story of




What you need:

- Needle and string
- 12 small pom-poms
- Wooden craft stick
- Scissors
- Googly eyes
- Glue
- Coffee filter
- Markers

What you do:

- 1. Sew pom-poms together to make a caterpillar body. Tie off that string.
- 2. Thread another string up through the first pompom, leaving 12 inches to dangle. Repeat with the ninth pom-pom, leaving two dangling strings.
- 3. Wrap those strings around opposite ends of the stick, adjusting their length to about 6 inches. Tie in place.
- 4. Glue on eyes.
- 5. Flatten the coffee filter and draw a symmetrical design on it. Pleat in the center to create wings.
- 6. Move the caterpillar puppet by holding the stick. Glue on the wings as you describe the transformation into a butterfly.


