

Note from Pastor Heidle November 2018 "Thanks be to God for His Inexpressible Gift!"

Dear Friends of Immanuel,

No doubt you have heard and maybe even said something to the effect that Thanksgiving is bigger than a one day celebration—that we should be thankful every day! True! But Thanksgiving is also bigger than just being grateful for food, home, material blessing, our American lifestyle, and God's first article gifts that we need for this body and life—our gratitude needs to also include the greater gift of salvation by God's grace in Christ Jesus! To that end it is fitting that we take a closer look at "*Give Thanks with a Grateful Heart*" as we spotlight



yet another "New Hymn" in our LSB hymnal. This hymn is so familiar to some, and others may have known it for such a long time, that you



may wonder how it can be considered a new hymn! Well, it's new to our hymnal (it has not been included in any of our previous hymnals) though this hymn was written in 1978!! And for those who may know it from a 1986 album by Don Moen, you may wonder why the author and composer is listed as Henry Smith (born 1952)and that's an interesting back story. Smith had trouble finding work after graduating from college and was inspired by his pastor to write a hymn referencing how Jesus made Himself poor that we might become rich. Smith began performing his song in

church where a visiting military officer learned it and took it with him to Europe. Years later, a friend played a recording of the song for Smith as

a song by an "unknown composer" and Smith said, "*I wrote that!*" About that time it was recorded by Don Moen and the recording company sought out the composer. How it took so long to find its way into our Lutheran hymnody is a mystery.

Lets take a look at the lyrics. ...

Although it looks like one long verse, there are three sections. In the first section three phrases are repeated to make six appeals for us to Give thanks to God! Indeed we should be grateful and from our heart thank the Holy One because He's given His own Son, Jesus, to be our Savior!! In the second section we find more repetition encouraging the weak to acknowledge that God makes them strong and the poor to acknowledge that God makes them rich, and all of that because of all that Jesus did for us! Please see 2 Cor. 9:15; 12:9-10; 8:9; 1 Cor. 15:57; Joel 3:10; and Eph. 6:10. The third section is a poignant repetition to simply and purely "Give thanks – give thanks." Do that, not just because of the Thanksgiving Day holiday, but because of all that Jesus has done for you as your Savior!! And that is worth singing about every day!

Give thanks for Jesus!!

FROM THE CENTRAL IL DISTRICT: Here is a story about Kendra. Your mission dollars were at work within our district to help her!

Things became unsettled when campus pastor Damon Jirovek went home to be with the Lord. For the next year or so, Kendra and her campus ministry family did their part to keep things going at Wittenberg. She learned a lot about serving, through experience.

After graduating in 2009, Kendra was a television news reporter and anchor at WEEK, Peoria; WSIE, Evansville, Indiana; and WGEM, Quincy. In 2011 she married Stephen Whittle. They have a little girl, Harper. Having served for a time as a Communications Specialist at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Kendra now works in public relations at Barnes Hospital and St. Louis Children's Hospital.

GIFT (SCRIP) CARDS: The November Scrip order is due to the church office by 1 pm on Nov. 12. You can pick up your cards after church on Nov. 18 or in the church office the following week. Scrip is a great way to raise money for the everyday expenses of our church home. Each vendor gives us a percentage of the face value of the card which is our *profit*; it can vary anywhere from 1.5% to 14%. These cards make perfect Christmas gifts or stocking stuffers! Order blanks are on the table in the chapel hallway. There are vendors available that are not listed on the order form. You can see a full list of vendors on the information bulletin board or on their website: www.shopwithscrip.com. Write the name of the vendor, denomination of the gift card, number of cards wanted, and total amount on a blank line of the order form. Most of the local fast food/chain restaurants (with varying rates of profit to the church), plus Meijer, Wal-Mart, and Big R have cards available every Sunday in the chapel hallway and in the church office during the week.

A MESSAGE FROM THE FOOD PANTRY:

Thank you for your continued donations! They are a tremendous help to our efforts to keep the food pantry going! Thanksgiving will be here before we know it, and we have much to be thankful for.
