

Dear Friends of Immanuel,

“For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.” – Rom. 3:28

As I sit down to write this month’s newsletter article, Reformation Day is nearly upon us. As you sit down to read this article, the day has already passed. Nevertheless, this day is an important one for us as Lutherans, and moreover as Christians.

Over 500 years ago a monk nailed his 95 theses to a church door in Wittenberg sparking what would soon come to be known as the “Reformation”. Among these theses, Luther wrote this, “The penalty of sin remains...until our entrance into the kingdom of heaven.” As a monk, Luther continually sought to atone for his sins, but could never find any reprieve in all of his works of fasting, continual penance, and even his acts of self-flagellation. In fact, as he considered his sinfulness, Luther only felt further and further removed from God and the love He promises to all of His children.

If anyone understood that the penalty of sin remained until our entrance into heaven, it was Luther. That is why the portion of Scripture quoted above is so vitally important to our lives as Christians. Once, during my time at the seminary, I had a professor tell my class “The doctrine on which the church of God stands or falls is the doctrine of Justification by Grace through Faith”. As I have spent nearly a decade in the ministry since hearing that quote, it has grown more and more true. How often are we lured into the false belief, like Luther, that we can somehow do enough to earn God’s love? How deeply have we been conditioned to believe that we are the only ones who can make amends for our misdeeds and failures? That is how the world works, isn’t it? Commit an injustice, and you will be required to make recompense.

But faith doesn’t work that way. All throughout Scripture we are reminded of our inability to do the very things we are commanded to do. “as it is written: ‘None is righteous, no, not one; no one understands; no one seeks for God. All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one.’” (Rom. 3:10-12), “We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like filthy rags. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like

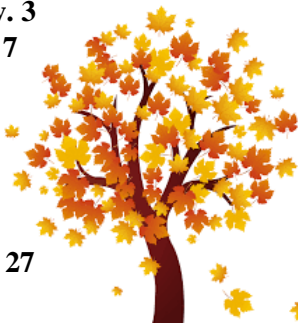
the wind, take us away.” (Is. 64:6), “For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it.” (Jas. 2:10). Yet how often do you hear the false notion that you can somehow appease God if you “just have a little more faith”, or do something like pray more fervently, trust more fully, or dedicate more of your time to your devotions? Make no mistake, all of those are good things. We ought all to have more faith, pray more, and spend more time in the Word of our Lord, but none of those things earn us salvation or forgiveness. Those are all the works that we are called to do and, as Paul says in Romans, they are not the things that can justify the sinner.

But we have something even greater than all of the works of our hands. We have the promise of Christ and Him crucified for us and our sin. We have a sure and certain place in which to place our hope and trust. We have a “Mighty Fortress” that will never fail us, no matter how lengthy or strong the assaults of the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh might be. One of my favorite quotes of Martin Luther brings the doctrine of justification by grace through faith home in a palpable way. “So when the devil throws your sins in your face and declares that you deserve death and hell, tell him this: ‘I admit that I deserve death and hell, what of it? For I know One who suffered and made satisfaction on my behalf. His name is Jesus Christ, Son of God, and where He is there I shall be also!’” This is what it means to trust and believe that, because of Christ alone, we are made inheritors of the heavenly kingdom of God. Through no work of our own could we ever earn that great and precious gift, but “Jesus Christ...has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness... This is most certainly true.” May this gift of Christ, and Him crucified for you, always be the proclamation that is on your lips and the confession that is in your hearts. For this truly is the doctrine on which the church of God stands or falls, and it is the doctrine around which our hope is founded and built.

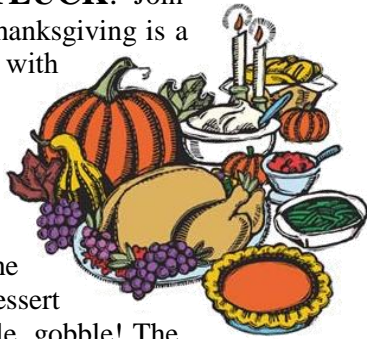

Take a break from those Thanksgiving dinner preparations to come to church to sing "Now Thank We All Our God."

It's time to start thinking about Christmas!

While we don't want to get ahead of Thanksgiving, there are some early Christmas notes to keep in mind in November. First, it's time to order poinsettias. Order forms will be available in the bulletins **Nov. 10, 17 & 24**. The deadline to order is **Nov. 25**. We will **deck the halls** of the church and sanctuary for Christmas on Saturday, **Dec. 7** at 9 am. We'll have coffee, cocoa and goodies available (and feel free to bring something of your own if you like). Many hands make easy work as we prepare for our Lord's birth this Advent and Christmas season. Please join us!



CEMETERY: There is a *door offering* for the cemetery **Nov. 3**. Donations are used to help with the expenses of regular maintenance such as mowing, cleanups, repairs, etc. Prayerfully consider bringing a special donation.

CAPITAL FUND DRIVE COMMITTEE: We have \$30,090 already saved for the next west side classroom windows. So far this year, fundraisers for the west windows (Super Bowl Subs, Valentine's sweets, PI day, rummage sales, 5 soup suppers, Men's Club Taste of Deutschland, Kohl's Cares Workday at the church, the concession at Danville Dans games, Hog Roast and Steak Fry) have raised \$19,553! **THANK YOU TO EVERYONE INVOLVED IN MAKING THOSE FUNDRAISERS SUCCESSFUL.** The next phase will be the windows for the two west side classrooms, the music room and the cafeteria which will cost \$26,960. If you or a group of members would like to sponsor a window by raising the money for it, please contact Jo Van Hoveln or Wayne Mann. We are planning to replace as many of the west side windows in the classroom wing as possible with the money that we have accumulated. Right now, that includes the windows mentioned in the prior paragraph plus the boys' and girls' bathrooms. The contractor has not given us a starting date yet. It's not too late to donate to the Capital Fund Drive. All donations from small to large are equally appreciated. GIFT (SCRIP) CARDS: The next scrip order is due to the church office by 1 pm on **Nov. 11**. These cards make excellent *Christmas gifts/stocking stuffers*; no fighting crowds for gifts that might have to be taken back to the store since the recipients can pick whatever they want. There are 2 order dates remaining before Christmas. Each vendor gives us a percentage of the face value of the card which is our *profit*; it can vary anywhere from 1.5% to 14%. This provides an extra \$700 to \$1,000 income a year for the church, and it could be much more if more people utilized this opportunity to help our church. Orders are not limited to the vendors listed on the order blank; if you want to order a vendor not listed, see if it is available by looking it up at www.shopwithscrip.com. Write the name of the vendor, denomination of the gift card, number of cards wanted, and total amount on a blank line of the order form. There are cards available **every Sunday** in the hallway and in the church office during the week.

CID LWML MITE BYTES: *Mission Grant #5 – Internships for Concordia University Chicago Church work Students - \$17,000*

This grant will allow CID, in 2020 and 2021, to make available to CUC Director of Christian Education (DCE) and Deaconess Students optional non-credit internships in the field of evangelism during the summer between their junior and senior years of college. This pilot project would take place in and around Springfield, with each intern serving four weeks in one area church, and then four weeks in another – if possible, one city church and another more rural church. Interns would develop and practice “real world” evangelism skills under the auspices of these congregations and pastors, augmenting their training and experience in this important part of church life. The funds would be used for a small stipend, transportation costs, and meals for the participants

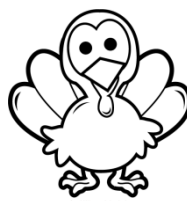
Immanuel Lutheran School News

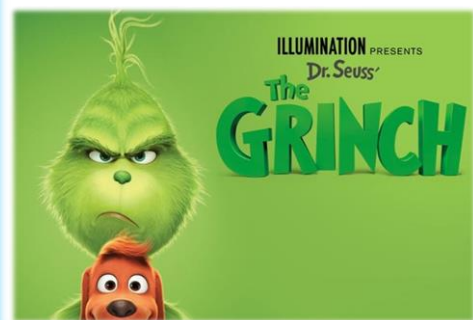
VETERANS CONCERT & SPAGHETTI DINNER

THANKSGIVING NAME CARDS

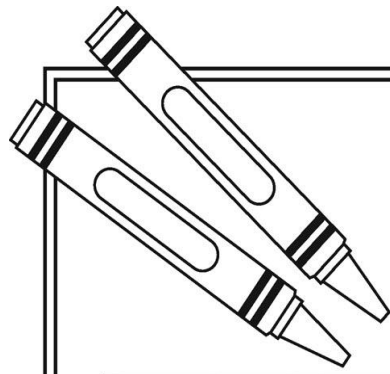
When you set your table this Thanksgiving, use these homemade name cards with a special message for each guest.

What you need:

- Index cards, any size (one per person)
- Markers
- Fall stickers (optional)
- Fall foam shapes (optional)

What you do:

1. List everyone who will be at your Thanksgiving dinner.
2. Fold each index card in half so it can stand.
3. On one side of each card, write a person's name.
4. Decorate around each name with markers, stickers or foam shapes.
5. On the blank side of each card, write a different Bible verse about blessings or giving thanks. Suggestions include 1 Chronicles 16:34; 1 Chronicles 29:13; Psalm 107:8; Psalm 118:21, 28; or 1 Thessalonians 5:18.
6. Another idea is to write one or more words from one verse on each person's card (depending on the number of guests and words). You can write the verse in order and have people read around the table, or you can mix up the words so guests have to put them in the correct order. (Remember to list the Scripture reference.)

Temptations abound, and sin comes all too naturally to the natural born sinner. But the blood of Jesus Christ, God's Son, cleanses us from all sin.

November 10 (2 Thessalonians 2:13)

“God Chose You”

To comfort the Thessalonians, the Apostle Paul reminds them, "God chose you to be saved." God comforts us with those same words. "God chose you." So that you may have peace, we are reminded He chose you to be with Him forever.

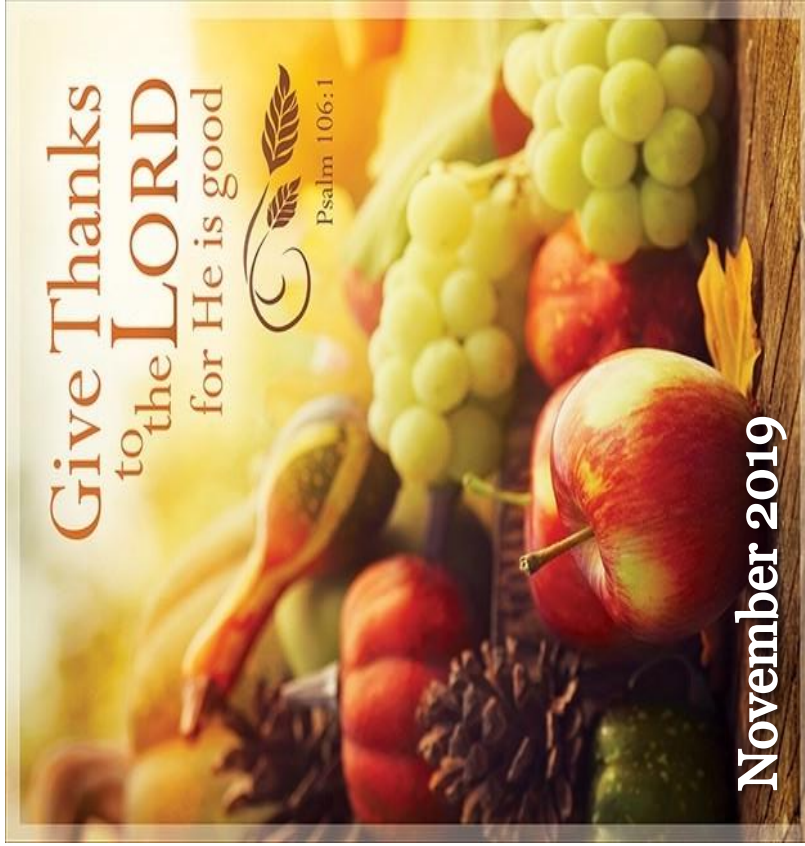

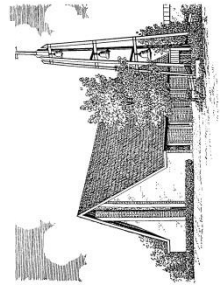
