[Jesus said], "So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." Matthew 10:32-33

What does it mean to "acknowledge [Jesus] before men"? I have been thinking about this question for a few days now, as it was the confirmation verse of Mary Jane Wilkinson who was called to be with her Lord just a few short days ago. Coincidentally, I was also listening to a podcast on my morning run in which the host recommended a movie entitled "Infidel" about a Christian man who is in an Arab country and dares to say, on national television, that "Jesus Christ is Lord". Predictably, he is taken hostage, and his wife struggles to free him from his imprisonment for daring to make such a claim in a Muslim dominated country. Now, I have not seen the film, but it's description did strike a chord with me. Is this what it means to "acknowledge [Jesus] before men"?

If that <u>is</u> the case, who would ever dare to do such a thing? Who would <u>want</u> to put their families through such a nightmarish situation? How does that square with "loving your neighbor as yourself"? Now, we live in a country where we are free to express our religious convictions, as they are protected by the United States Constitution, aren't we? Yet, I wonder, how often our confession of faith might get us into some hot water even here in the land of the free and the home of the brave. We've seen it, time and again, as those who hate religion persecute and harass the Lord's people. We see it even now as the opening of a Supreme Court seat has once more thrown our country into turmoil.

If you've not been following the news, one of the top candidates to fill that seat is a woman by the name of Amy Coney Barrett who is a Roman Catholic mother of seven. Guess what the big complaint against her is? If you guessed her religious convictions, you would be right. If this is the treatment that is received for merely *living out your faith*, who is willing to take that cross and bear it?

But that is the <u>very</u> thing that our Lord calls His people to do. But He doesn't call us to do it without attaching a promise to the command. He tells us, you and I together with all of His people the world over, "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly

in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." Where the burdens of this world are impossible for us to bear up of our own accord, our Lord promises His people that there is respite to be found. When the burdens of the world become too great, He does not idly stand by, cheering you on. He does not attempt to motivate you with inspirational words or kitschy sayings. Your Lord promises you that He will, in fact He has.ps...has.ps..

He calls you, His people, the ones for whom He died, to come to Him and lay your burdens down at the foot of His cross. He calls you to come to Him in your weariness and weakness, and to receive the blessings of His cross, on which He won for you the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation. Because Jesus died your death to sin and rose again to new life you have the promise that no enemies of His, and thus yours as His children, will ever be able to overcome you. So, what does it mean to "acknowledge [Jesus] before men"? It means to live in the hope and promise of eternal life. It means making the confession of your faith, even when the consequences seem overwhelming. It means loving your neighbor as yourself, even when you would rather not. It means living in the joy of the cross of Jesus Christ, and always having an answer for that joy that is in your heart so that, when you are asked, you may have a clear confession on your lips and point to Him who died for the sins of the whole world, your Savior Jesus Christ.

Will it always be easy? No. Will you be tempted to hide your faith away for the sake of expedience? Yes. But we have been promised by our Lord that those hard times are not ours alone to bear. We do not walk this journey alone, because our Savior promises that He will never leave nor forsake us. So as things all around seem to be devolving into greater and greater chaos, I pray that you will remember the promise of your Lord, "In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." May His promise, given you in the Word and Sacrament, bring peace, hope, and comfort to your hearts today and always!

We daily trust God's good gifts for our faith and life. Such confidence also belongs to the faith and life of the whole church.

Gracious giving God, give us your help again, just as you have always done. Remind us of your care. Let there be gratitude in our congregation, for all that is needful has been sent and ordained for us already. As we work to call a new pastor to our congregation, may we be strengthened for this task with the thought that your providing reaches to every need of your church. Did you know that nearly 70% of Americans take at least one prescription drug, and more than half take two? That's a whole lot of empty pill bottles when the medication is gone. While some of these bottles are recycled or reused, many of them end up in landfills. Cincinnati based Matthew 25: Ministries, an international humanitarian aid and disaster relief organization, accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles that are either sent to places where medical supplies are needed or are shredded and recycled. Many times, the pills people receive in developing countries are wrapped in paper scraps, leaves, or put in pockets. They have no protection from moisture or the elements. And they certainly are not safely out of the reach of small children. Those orange pill bottles we take for granted are gratefully received in many parts of the world.


Matthew 25: Ministries accepts the following:

- Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles
- Large and small pill bottles
- Pill bottles with and without child resistant caps
- Pill bottles without medical labels are preferred

If possible, remove the label. You can do this by submerging the bottle in a pot of boiling water if it doesn't easily peel off. If there is still a little sticky residue on the bottle, lemon oil will easily remove it.

Please remove any spring or summer decorations you want to keep. 


