**GOD LANGUISES WITH US:** A headline from last spring teased, “There’s a Name for the Blah You’re Feeling.” The writer decided what he and others felt as the pandemic wore on wasn’t burnout or depression, but *languishing* — decreasing vitality; feeling dispirited. People of ancient times experienced this too: “The land of Egypt and the land of Canaan languished because of the famine” (Genesis 47:13). “The wine dries up, the vine languishes, all the merry-hearted sigh” (Isaiah 24:7). But there’s more. If you used to be “merry-hearted” but now sigh a lot, hear this: “The heavens languish together with the earth” (Isaiah 24:4). Isaiah uses “the heavens” to refer to God, who languishes with us. Like an empathizing friend, God sits *with* us in our struggle. Sure, we pray for rescue *now*: “I am languishing; O Lord, heal me” (Psalm 6:2). But when our timing isn’t God’s, we trust his promise of restoration: “[God] will wipe every tear from their eyes ... mourning and crying and pain will be no more” (Revelation 21:4). With the psalmist we hold two truths at once: “My soul languishes for your salvation; I hope in your word” (119:81).

## BOARD OF DIRECTORS SUMMARY:

- **ILS REPORT:** There are currently 42 enrolled after our Meet the Teacher Day. The program is going very well.
- **NEW BUSINESS:** Wayne Mann resigned from his position as the Director of Properties. A motion passed by unanimous consent to appoint Scott Huckstadt for the remainder of the term with elections in June 2022. A motion was passed by unanimous consent to remain on our current health plan. The board is currently investigating a few options to improve the audio in the back of the sanctuary.
- **CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:** Sue DeMoss reported that all contracts are completed and experience was figured in to hourly wages. Desserts are needed for the Back to School Party, the Men's Club is cooking for it, and Dave Creek is donating bounce houses to use that evening (thanks, Dave!). A lot of good ideas came from the garden meeting. Summer Camp's final profit for the school was \$14,210.69.
- **FINANCE:** Reviewed financial reports. Audits of all church account will begin after the September Board meeting. A motion passed by unanimous consent to close the 2020 – 2021 Fiscal year.
- **PROPERTIES:** The new school gutters have been installed. Roof leaks have been repaired and ceiling tiles replaced. The water fountain in the school was replaced. We are grateful to our plumber, who donates his time! Keys have been copied for the breaker boxes at the school and hung up high near the boxes. Our insurance carrier, Church Mutual, will come for a property walk-through. Scott will investigate the parsonage ice maker that is not working. Sue DeMoss reported that nails are protruding from the playground equipment.
- **STEWARDSHIP:** We will host another Rummage Sale in October. Lunch-to-Go to start up again soon.
- **EVANGELISM:** Trunk or Treat is scheduled for October 24<sup>th</sup> from 4 – 6 pm.
- **WORSHIP:** We have made some slight changes due to the recent uptick in Covid cases. We had an acolyte training. Tom will contact Choir members to see if there is any interest in starting back up. Rally Day service will be outdoors again on the last Sunday in September.
- **PARISH EDUCATION:** Coffee to Go will begin soon. The committee brainstormed some ideas regarding the church library, more info to come later.
- **MISSIONS & SOCIAL MINISTRY:** Joyce Martin shared a thank you letter from Crosspoint Human Services. The Food Pantry may begin providing assistance to Day Spring Women and Children's Center.
- **ELDERS:** Don DeMoss reported on membership changes. Elders send cards monthly.
- **PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Yonkers reported that he is keeping up on Covid recommendations. He has obtained LERT certification. He met with Kurt about

Confirmation classes. Pastor will lead both the Men's and Women's Bible Studies. The first ILS Chapel is tomorrow.

- **VICEPRESIDENT:** Butch, along with finance, is closely following the school enrollment and costs as the year gets going to manage the budget. A post-call Call Committee dinner meeting is scheduled with the Yonkers family. Butch would like to see if there is any interest for a couples/family Bible Study once a month. We would invite school families and have kids' activities planned. Work with Worship, Pastor, Christian Education, Parish Education, and the ILS Director and faculty to make connections.
- **PRESIDENT:** Josh is leading the investigation of the audio in the church, and following up with the attorney regarding the Schuring bequest.
- **NEXT MEETING:** September 21, 2021 at 6:30 pm.




Do you sometimes think that your praying is useless? Wrong! The prayer of a believer is powerful. God always hears and answers that prayer, and in the best possible way.

# Prayer bracelet

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.



## What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

## What you do:

1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):

- **blue** = the Father
- **white** = God's holiness
- **gold** = God's kingdom
- **green** = the earth
- **yellow** = wheat (bread)
- **red** = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
- **black** = temptation
- **orange** = God's power to deliver


