Little ones understand Christ's love long before they understand theology. Some children might enjoy setting up a nativity decoration or scene they can touch in the home as you prepare for Christmas decorations. There are also loads of art projects online for creating your own nativity scene with your child(ren). Your confidence and ease in mentioning Christ during the holidays is what matters most. We all enjoy the other holiday festivities such as Santa and his elves, the Grinch, or Elf on the Shelf, but please don't neglect to teach your child about the most important theme of all: the birth of our Savior. Give them a foundation into their faith that will not abandon them as they become adults. Plant those seeds now while they are open to Christ's love and interested in your teachings.
