

# Family of God

As we leave December, Christmas, and the holidays behind us, perhaps our minds are still on our family. As we reach the end of the holidays, we think about the loved ones in our lives, and our hearts may be turned in many different directions. Just look at the list of people mentioned above. We have this peace together, not in ourselves, but in the identity given to us by our Heavenly Father—as the children of God and the family of Christ.

Here in His family, here in His Kingdom, His gifts flow forth—greater than those found beneath any earthly tree. For they come not from an evergreen, but from the Tree of Life itself: the cross of Christ, from which His blood flows forth, forgiving our sins and renewing our hearts.

Our Heavenly Father has blessed and gifted us abundantly, and Jesus Christ our Lord has given us new life in Him. The Holy Spirit has called us by the Gospel and brought us together, enlightening us with that same Gospel and giving the Church its identity as the family of God. In Him we are never alone—always united to Him, always a part of the communion of saints, and always members of His family. We are never alone. Be with your family, be with your church, and be with your God. Happy New Year.

## PRECIOUS LORD, TAKE MY HAND

Thomas Dorsey, a jazz musician from Atlanta, made a bold decision in 1926 to leave behind secular music and devote his talent to writing songs for the Lord. But following that call wasn't easy. During the Great Depression, many church leaders criticized his soulful gospel style, calling it "the devil's music." Dorsey later joked, "I got kicked out of some of the best churches in the land."

Then, in 1932, tragedy struck. While in St. Louis for a revival, he received a telegram that his wife had died suddenly during childbirth. His faith was shaken to the core, and grief nearly silenced him. Yet in his deepest sorrow, Dorsey turned back to what he knew best — music. Out of that heartbreak came one of the most beloved hymns of all time:

*"Precious Lord, take my hand,  
Lead me on, let me stand.  
I am tired, I am weak, I am worn..."*

Dorsey's song reminds us that even in our valleys, God is near — guiding us, strengthening us, and using our pain to comfort others who walk the same road.

*He who fritters away the early morning, its opportunity and freshness, in other pursuits than seeking God will make poor headway seeking him the rest of the day. If God is not first in our thoughts and efforts in the morning, he will be in the last place the remainder of the day.*

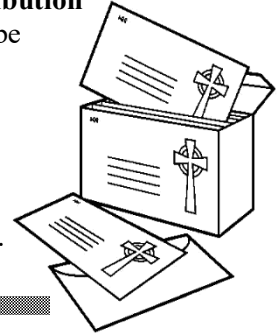

## CAPITAL FUND DRIVE

The current bank balance is \$221,252 which includes a Certificate of Deposit and a \$50,000 grant from Julius W. Hegeler II Foundation which has not been received yet. Our current project is reroofing the flat roofs of the school/gym wing of our building and replacing the skylights. The reroofing portion of this project has been completed, and the skylights will be installed weather permitting. This project will total approximately \$260,000. We have applied for a grant to help pay for this project and have not been informed yet whether we will receive it, but we still need the donations of our congregation to be able to fund this project. Donations do not have to be one large amount; they can be smaller monthly or quarterly donations; tailor your donations to fit your budget. The congregation established the Capital Fund Drive in 2012, and thanks to our generous congregation, we have accomplished many needed upgrades/renovations. Prior generations worked and sacrificed to build the school/church building, and it is up to us to preserve and improve our church home just as we would our own household's.

**PROJECTS COMPLETED:** Thanks be to God the Father for His wonderful gift to us of His Son, Jesus. The following accomplishments are made through the generous giving of our congregation! Without these generous gifts of time, talents, and monetary donations since 2012, these projects wouldn't have been possible. The prior years' projects are:

- New organ \$18,565
- Replaced the HVAC in the sanctuary and office wing \$125,083.
- New lights in the sanctuary \$17,374
- New flat roof over the sanctuary 3,405
- AED (Automated External Defibrillator) for the sanctuary \$1,199—funded entirely through grant from Vermilion Healthcare Foundation
- Parsonage:
  - New HVAC \$6,650
  - New roof \$7,755
  - Attic insulation \$1,745
  - Electrical work \$1,321
  - Crawlspace insulation and vapor barrier
  - Asphalt driveway \$7,525
  - Kitchen cabinets, master bath shower, sliding glass door \$9,920.
  - New flooring in some rooms of parsonage \$5,011
- Partial payment towards new playground equipment (from Hog Roast proceeds) \$4,149
- Paid down and provided monthly payments for the church mortgage \$104,735.
- New cafeteria stoves/ovens \$9,562
- Drainage tile around building and parsonage \$21,235
- South portion of parking lot resealed and restriped \$8,960

- Replacing school wing windows \$113,329 (\$10,000 was received from Cadle grant and \$8,100 from bequests account)
- Guttering on school wing \$13,835
- Resurfacing gym floor \$2,500
- New lighting for driveway \$22,168
- New guttering over the chapel door \$195
- New guttering and downspouts for the sanctuary \$4,900
- Resealing and striping of the north portion of the parking lot \$14,277

**UPDATED MESSAGE - THANK YOU!** We had set a deadline of December 31, 2025, for the fundraising of \$260,000 for the school/gym wing reroofing project. As of that date we have raised \$238,959! Of that amount, only \$66,000 are grants; the rest is totally from the generosity of this congregation. The roofing portion of the project has been completed, and the skylight replacement will be done weather permitting.

**SCRIP ORDERS:** Are you looking for a thoughtful gift, or just want to make your everyday purchases work for a good cause? Scrip cards are great gifts for any special occasion! The next Scrip order is due to the church office by 9 am on **Jan. 12** and will be ready for pick up on **Jan. 18**. 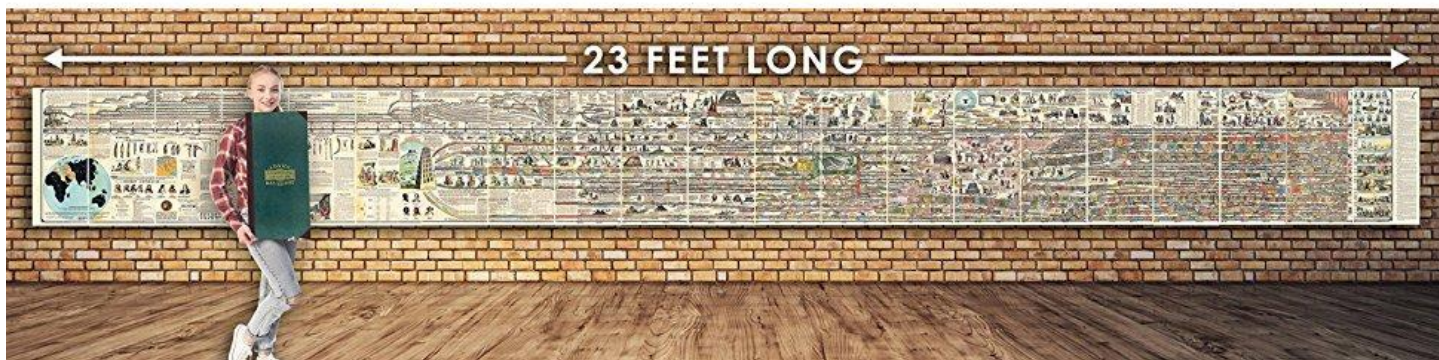

# Adams' Syn Chronological Chart of Universal History



*Have you noticed anything new in our hallway?!* It's quite the display, so if you have been in our hallway, I'm certain you have! We are excited to announce a new addition to our walls. Let me introduce you to the Adams Syn Chronological Chart of Universal History.

*What is it?* Adams' *Syn Chronological Chart of Universal History* is a visual timeline that presents world history as it unfolds alongside the Biblical account, showing God's guiding hand through nations, rulers, and events from Creation to the modern era.

*About the Author...* Adams' *Synchronic Chronological Chart of Universal History* was created by **Sebastian C. Adams** (1825–1898), an American historian and relative of President Adams, cartographer, and educator. Deeply interested in history, chronology, and biblical study, Adams sought to present world history in a clear, visual format that showed how biblical events and secular history unfolded together. First published in 1871, the chart reflects his conviction that all history is unified and purposeful.

*There is A LOT of information on there!* There is a key that accompanies the chart, but it is 60 pages long! If anyone would like to borrow the full key, you are welcome to do so, just ask Kim in the church office. Here is a simple guideline to help you out.

- **Timeline:** The stream of time is represented by the black wavy line, about a quarter of the way down from the top of the chart that runs from left to right. This "stream" is divided into 100-year segments called century posts. The 100-year segments are further broken down by red vertical lines marking decades. Nations and kingdoms are represented by the wider colored streams. Each sovereign or ruler is represented by a different color. When a nation begins or first appears in history, the stream begins. When one nation conquers another, the stream sweeps across, absorbs it, and moves on wider than before.
- **Biblical History:** The 3,607 years of Bible history, as found in the books of the Old Testament, are placed above the stream of time, while each book is placed in its historic order and proper time. Here's an interesting fact for you – the history in Genesis, beginning with Adam and ending in 1635 B.C., embraces the long period of 2,370 years. The other 38 books of the Old Testament, beginning with Exodus and ending with Malachi, only embrace 1,238 years of history!

- **Genealogy of Christ:** 60 generations from Adam to Joseph and Mary. The genealogy of Christ is represented by the irregular broken lines just below the stream of time.
- **The Family Tree from the Flood to Moses:** The chart traces the generations from Noah through Shem and his descendants, showing the careful preservation of the promised line. The chart visually follows the lineage through key patriarchs: Arphaxad, Shelah, Eber, Peleg, Reu, Serug, Nahor, and Terah, leading to Abraham, then Isaac, Jacob, and finally Moses. This section highlights the continuity of God's covenant promises and places the biblical family line within the broader flow of post-Flood world history.
- **Profane History:** Profane history refers to the secular history of nations and empires running alongside the biblical record. This portion of the chart traces the rise and fall of major civilizations—such as Egypt, Assyria, Babylon, Persia, Greece, and Rome—showing how their rulers, events, and timelines intersect with sacred history. By placing profane and biblical history side by side, the chart emphasizes that world events unfold under God's overarching plan and within the same historical timeline.

*Where did we get it?* During our church bus trip to the Ark Encounter this past August, we picked up the replica of Adams' Synchronic Chronological Chart of Universal History from the gift shop. While there, we were able to see an impressive large-scale display of the chart, which highlighted just how powerful this visual tool can be. This chart makes a wonderful addition to our church because it clearly and beautifully shows how biblical history unfolds alongside world history, helping viewers of all ages see God's hand at work throughout time and deepening our understanding of Scripture within the broader story of history. A heartfelt thank you to Don DeMoss and RJ Davis for their beautiful handiwork in figuring out how to hang a 23-foot display so seamlessly – it truly looks amazing! We hope you will take some time to stop by, see it for yourself, and take in all it has to offer. The possibilities are endless. The more you make use of the timeline, the more your knowledge will grow. This amazing tool will help you understand the big picture and comprehend vast amounts of knowledge.

**January 11, 2026*****“The Baptism of Jesus” by Rev. Dr. Walter Maier III*****Sermon Text: Matthew 3:13-17**

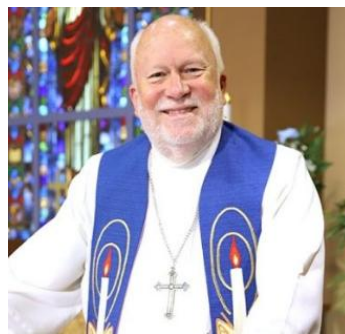

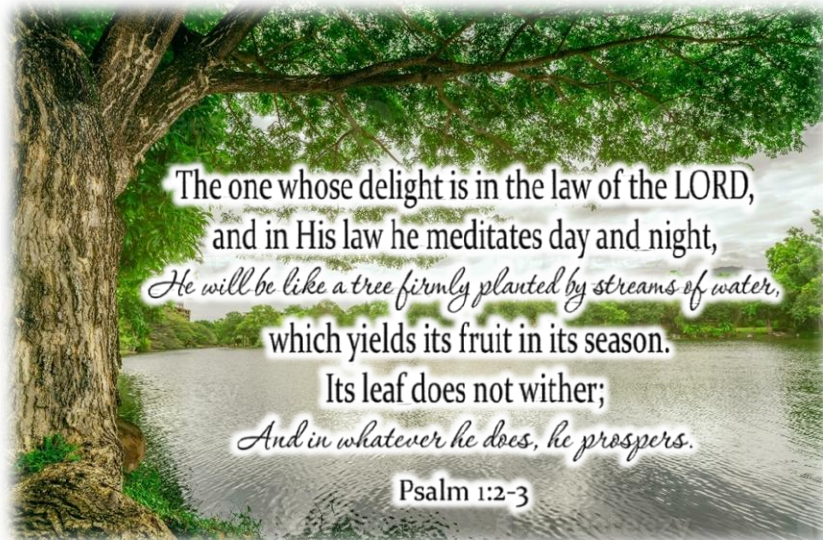

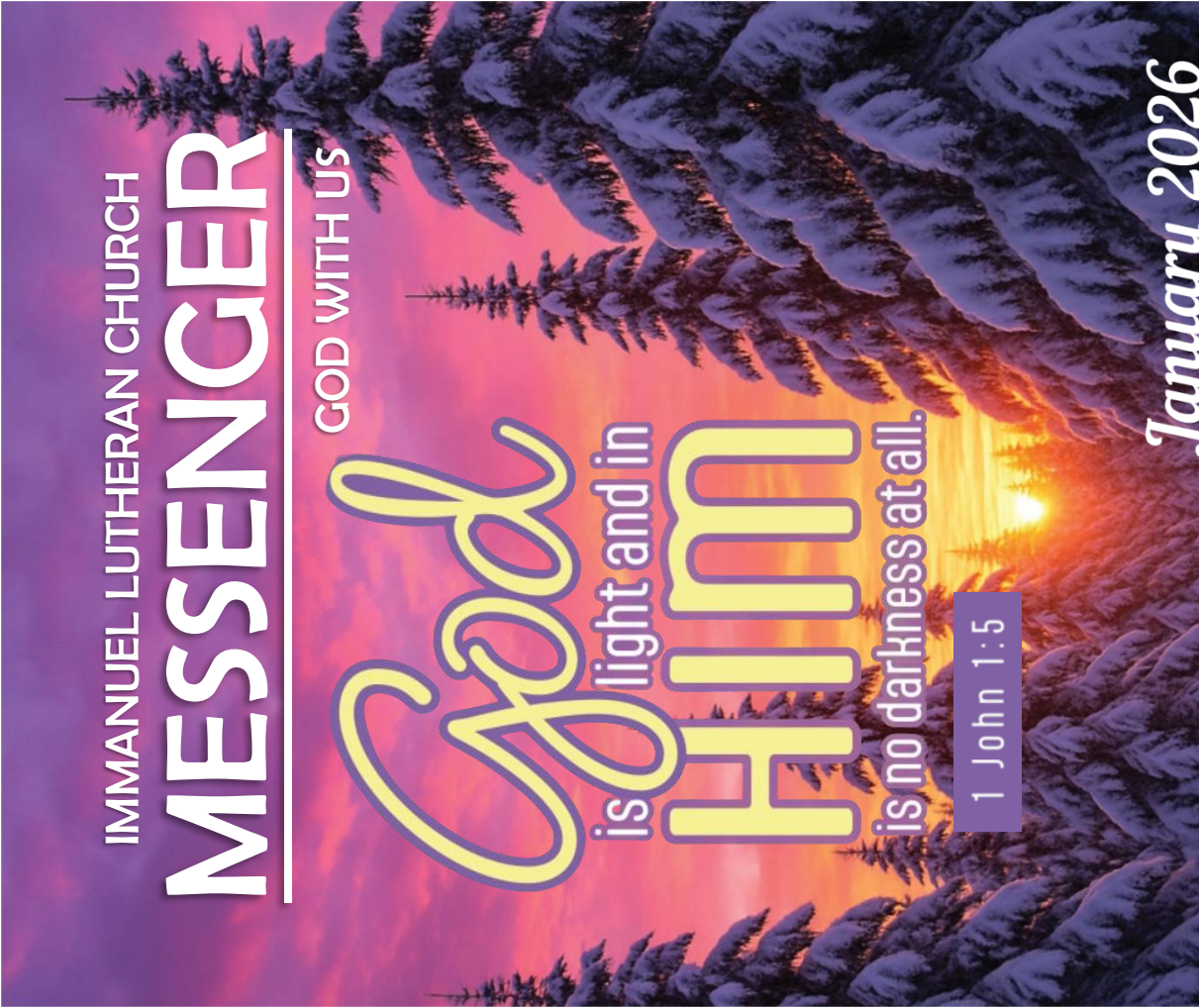
