C.S. Lewis spent a great deal of his time devoted to the problem of pain, the reason for suffering. Many theologians wrestle with this question, be it phrased as “the problem of pain”, or as others put it, “the reason for suffering”. This is a question that is not just a religious one, but one that those outside of any faith wrestle with and often throw into our faces when we speak of a loving God.

God is all knowing. God knew what would happen when the Trinity in unison declare “Let us make man in our image” (Gen 1:26), I have said is from the pulpit. The creation of man, of humanity, was a joint work of the three persons of the Trinity. Indeed, this is one of the few times in Scripture that we hear the three persons of the Trinity speak in unison together using the first person plural.

From this verse we can imagine the voice of the Father pondering man’s creation as He knew that sin would result. We can imagine Jesus willingly volunteering to go to the cross. Once more we can hear the Spirit speak up, volunteering to call, gather, and enlighten us all into the faith and bring us to the waters of baptism. God is love and wishes for one to love.

So where does is the problem of pain come from? It comes from sin. But God is all powerful, couldn’t he have stopped Adam and Eve, and therefore all of us, from sinning? Yes, but He would have had to take away freewill. This would have made us unlike God, and instead like the rest of the animals. Cute and adorable, but no longer humans and no longer made in His image.

Secondly, as we look at pain and suffering we come at it with the perspective that we are good, but we are not. We are fallen sinful human beings. We are, as we say in the confession, “born sinful and unclean”. When we face pain and suffering we tend to forget this fact and view ourselves as good. We forget that no one is good except for God alone” (Mark 10:18). But I am good. I have been washed in the blood of the Lamb, and clothed in the white robe of Christ and His salvation, we say. Yes, but not of ourselves. We are by God’s grace and the blood of Jesus good. To think ourselves good by our own nature, as we so often do, is to deny that the old Adam is still in us and that this old creature must, in the words of Luther’s Small Catechism, “by daily contrition be drowned and die”. Again, we are by nature sinful and unclean. Therefore, we deserve none of the good things in our life, and we, as said before, deserve only our suffering.

The problem of pain then stems from our misunderstanding of who we are by nature. We like to look at creation and ourselves, we like to read that God made His creation “good”, and that after making Adam and Eve on the sixth day, after making humanity, you and me, “it was very good” (Genesis 1:31). The fall changed everything. No longer does God walk among us in the same way as He did in the garden of Eden with Adam and Eve before the fall. Sin separates God’s creation from Himself. This is why Adam and Eve were cast out of the Garden of Eden after the fall.

In the fullness of time this rift will be eliminated. On the last day Christ will come again to judge the living and the dead. Then the earth and all of creation will be destroyed a new Heaven and a new earth will be created and we will live in paradise forever. Until then the wheat and the tears grow side by side in this world. Sin has been defeated. Death has lost its sting, no longer do we, as Christians, die to eternal damnation that is our rightful place, but we die belonging to the Lord, and will be raised to new and eternal life with the Lord. Here lies our hope. Here, is our paradise. Yet, we don’t want to wait for it, we want it now. Let us not turn from the Lord in the midst of our suffering, but instead let us turn to the Lord asking for His presence and for perseverance so that we might win the race and the crown, so that we might, through the cross of Christ, inherit everlasting life. Christ has died, Christ has risen, and Christ will come again. Let us cling to this truth and to the hope that it gives us, so that we may endure all things and come to the inheritance of heaven that is ours through Christ Jesus our Lord.

STEWARDSHIP SPOT: Rooted in Christ, growing in stewardship: The heartland is now awash in various hues of green. The doldrums of winter give way to the colors of spring. Now, the promise of spring gives way to the growth of summer. Fields are planted and sprouted. Gardens are planted. Flowers adorn the beds of neighborhood homes and roadside ditches. Green is the shade of life! Green growth is also the hue of the faithful steward. The seed of faith planted in human hearts in the waters of Holy Baptism grows as it is nurtured in the Word proclaimed and ingested in the Holy Supper. This faith does indeed save. But our stewardship of the Gospel is also designed to bear fruit for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor.

To consider this, let us look at the hymn, "Fruitful Trees, the Spirits Sowing" (LSB 691). It is very much a stewardship hymn!

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's sowing, may we ripen and increase, Fruit to life eternal growing, rich in love and joy and peace.

- The tree of faith is not planted in us by us. It is the Spirit's work! We do not claim the title "steward." Rather, we are created for it (Gen. 1:26–28).
- He is the One who makes it grow in us. The fruits of the Spirit are borne out because we, by grace through faith, are connected to the vine that is Jesus (John 15).

Laden branches freely bearing Gifts the Giver loves to bless; Here is fruit that grows by sharing, Patience, kindness, gentleness.

- Our stewardship is NOT about what we do. It is about what the Holy Spirit does in and through us. That is the fruit that we bear. His fruit for His purposes.
- But that fruit is lived out through us. The world sees the fruit of our stewardship of the Gospel in lives lived connected to Word and Sacrament.

Rooted deep in Christ our Master, Christ our pattern and our goal, teach us, as the years fly faster, Goodness, faith, and self-control.

- Stewards have been created and redeemed to reflect the image of Jesus in the world. He is the pattern. We reflect to others around us the Light of the Gospel He has shone on us.
- This reflection comes when Christ's goodness flows from us to others.

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's tending, may we grow till harvests cease; Till we taste, in life unending, Heaven's love and joy and peace.

- Just as the Spirit has created us for stewardship of the Gospel, so also does He cause our faithfulness! He calls, gathers, enlightens, sanctifies and KEEPS us in this faithful stewardship of the Gospel.
- The ultimate goal of our faithful stewardship is eternity. For us. For our neighbor. All worked out by the Spirit.

Green is the color of the world right now. It is also the color of our stewardship, and it is growing in us as we are connected to the vine, Jesus! God grant our growth in Him!

The congregation established the Capital Fund Drive in 2012, and thanks to our generous congregation, we have accomplished many needed upgrades/renovations. Prior generations worked and sacrificed to build the school/church building, and it is up to us to preserve and improve our church home just as we would our own household's. There is a Capital Fund Drive bulletin board in the hallway between the coat room and the parish mailboxes. There are special envelopes at the same bulletin board located between the coat room and the member mailboxes for ongoing donations throughout the year. *"...because of my devotion to the house of my God I give my treasure for the house of my God. 1 Chronicles 29:3b.* All donations from large to small are equally appreciated. Pray for the Capital Fund and the completion of the current project.

Do you like surprises? Our God is a God of surprises. Tune in to Worship Anew and hear the surprises God has for you.



Despite the fact that by nature we were enemies of God, He in His love and grace made us his children. We have been adopted by God. That means for us tremendous blessings in this life and in future glories.




