Experience the Creation Museum! Join us for a special day trip to the Creation Museum in Petersburg, KY on Saturday, **Aug. 29!** Open to all – ILCD members, ILS families, and friends of every age – this adventure promises a day filled with faith, fellowship, learning, and fun. Guests will enjoy exploring the museum's many fascinating exhibits, including the moving pro-life exhibit, "Fearfully & Wonderfully Made," and the stunning "Radiance" exhibit, along with beautiful gardens, walking trails, the Creation Zoo, and the state-of-the-art Stargazer Planetarium.

This is a very family-friendly trip! The charter bus has storage compartments for strollers, and families are welcome to leave snacks, toys, books, and other items on the bus during the day, so you don't have to carry everything with you throughout the museum.

The prices listed include museum admission, a meal voucher for an entrée, side, and drink from Sprig & Stone, as well as one show at the Stargazer Planetarium. We do need a minimum of 15 participants to receive the group rate, and the bus can accommodate up to 55 passengers. Be sure to sign up early — last year's trip to the Ark Encounter filled the bus! A sign-up sheet is available on the information table in the chapel hallway or call the church office. We hope you'll join us for a day of Christian fellowship and discovery!

- Children (10 and under): \$25.00

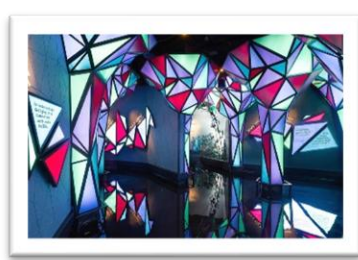
The Creation Museum is in Petersburg, KY, which is approximately two hundred miles, and the bus trip will take about 3 hours each way.

We celebrate and honor you, and we pray that you feel surrounded by love, joy, and appreciation, not just on Father's Day, but every day.

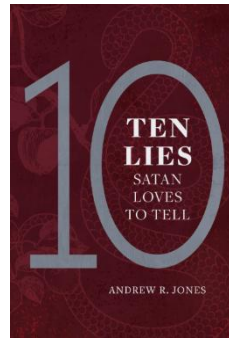

A FRESH LOOK & NEW VISION FOR ILS:

The Reggio Emilia Program

Our preschool will be implementing the Reggio Emilia approach and philosophy beginning next fall. What first came to light during a Christian Education Board meeting was later approved by the Board of Directors and is now becoming a reality. This is an exciting direction for our preschool and will help ensure that ILS remains a top choice in our community for families seeking a Christ-centered education for their young children.

Our preschool is one of our greatest outreach opportunities. By offering a Reggio Emilia approach, we will continue providing high-quality early childhood education while also strengthening the ministry and biblical teaching woven throughout our curriculum. As part of this transition, several updates and improvements are being made throughout the school.

The Program and Philosophy

The Reggio Emilia philosophy originated in Italy after World War II and has since gained worldwide recognition for its child-centered approach to early childhood education. This philosophy emphasizes nurturing children's natural curiosity, creativity, and sense of community through hands-on exploration and collaborative learning experiences. Teachers serve as guides and facilitators, encouraging children to express themselves in many ways, often referred to as the "hundred languages of children."

In the Reggio Emilia approach, the environment itself plays a central role and is often called the "third teacher." Classrooms are designed to be open, inviting, and filled with materials that inspire creativity, investigation, and discovery. Natural light, flexible spaces, and displays of children's work help foster a sense of belonging and pride while encouraging collaboration and respect for each child's ideas and contributions. By valuing relationships, creativity, and the learning environment, the Reggio Emilia philosophy creates a dynamic and engaging educational experience for young children.

Preparing the Environment

Part of this new philosophy includes creating classroom and learning spaces that foster creativity, exploration, and calm engagement. Earthy tones and a quieter, simpler environment help invite children to explore the world around them while allowing teachers to carefully guide, observe, and document each child's learning and development.

With the new paint and classroom updates, ILS will continue shaping an environment that encourages self-exploration, creativity, and learning.

For those concerned about the budget, our teachers connected with the community organization Serve Together, whose volunteers will generously donate their

time, bring the painting supplies and equipment, and complete the painting work while school is not in session. The school only needs to provide the paint itself. Serve Together will be assisting on **June 13**. This partnership not only helps us complete these updates affordably, but it also creates positive opportunities to build connections within our community.

What About the New Equipment?

Some have expressed concern about certain toys and equipment being removed and replaced. Please know that the previous toys and materials have not been discarded. They have been cleaned, organized, and placed into storage should the church or school wish to use them in the future.

Many of the new materials, playground equipment, and gym toys have been purchased through a generous grant secured by our preschool director, Mrs. S. This grant funding has allowed us to improve our learning spaces and provide new opportunities for our students with little financial burden placed on the congregation.

Moving Forward Together

We understand that change can sometimes feel overwhelming, and questions or concerns are completely understandable. We want our congregation and ILS families to know that these updates are being made thoughtfully, with the approval and guidance of our boards, the school teachers and staff, and careful stewardship of resources through grants and volunteers.

There is always much work to be done in God's kingdom, and we are grateful for everyone who has stepped forward to help. We invite our congregation and school families to continue asking questions, learning more, participating, and supporting this exciting new chapter for our preschool ministry. In many ways, that spirit of collaboration and shared discovery is at the heart of the Reggio Emilia philosophy itself. There is a vision board displayed in the narthex, and we encourage everyone to take a look and see the exciting direction our preschool is heading.

FROM GRATITUDE TO FAITHFUL PRAISE:

Gratitude is the beginning of faith; faith leads us to the ultimate gratitude. Gratitude is often the first quiet step of faith. Before answers come, before circumstances change, gratitude teaches the heart to notice God's presence and provision. Scripture reminds us, "In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18, KJV). Giving thanks, even in uncertain moments, opens our eyes to God's faithfulness already at work. As gratitude grows, it naturally leads us into deeper trust. When we remember what God has done, faith finds solid ground. "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1, KJV). Gratitude strengthens that hope by anchoring it in God's past mercies. Each thankful prayer becomes a reminder that the same God who carried us before will carry us again. Faith, in turn, leads us to ultimate gratitude, not just for blessings received, but for God himself. "Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift" (2 Corinthians 9:15, KJV). This gratitude reaches beyond circumstances and rests in Christ, the greatest gift of all. When gratitude begins our journey and faith guides our steps, our hearts learn lasting praise, thankful not only for what God gives, but for who he is.

June 14, 2026***“Our New Heritage”* by Rev. Paul Shoemaker****Sermon Text: Romans 5:6-15**

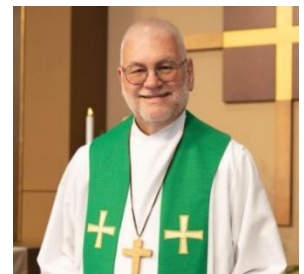

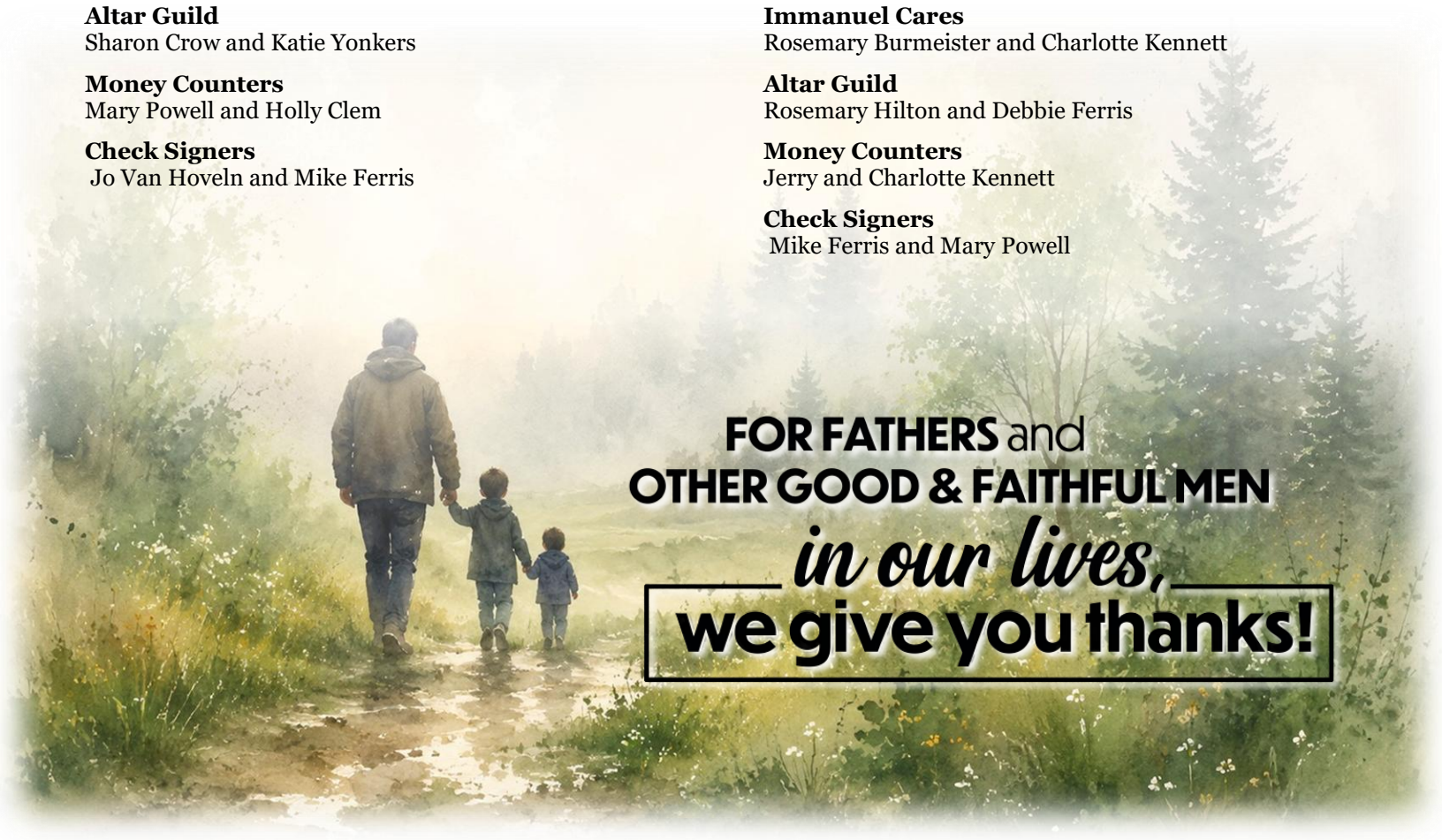
