

May 14 is Mother's Day. It seems only right that we should take time to remember the women who dedicated themselves to raising us up, to raising our children up. Motherhood is a special vocation. God has given to mother's the task of bearing children, nursing children, and being an example to them. They raise us up in the ways of the Lord, and prepare us to go out and live on our own.

Scripture is full of examples of wonderful and blessed mothers. Eve, Sarah, Rebekah, Rachel, Jochobed, Hannah, Bathsheba, Elizabeth, and Mary. None of these mothers were perfect, but they all showed love to their children, and brought them up in the way of the Lord.

On May 14 we will take time to think our mothers and remember what a special vacation they filled, and what a blessing they are to our lives.

Eve was the first mother. She gave birth to three sons named in Genesis, and presumably other sons and daughter not named. She was the first mother. She faced all the things mothers face today, not the least of which is rivalry between her sons. This is made evident in Genesis 4 when Cain kills Able. Yet still she remained a mother and brought up Seth who would become a man and raise children of his own.

Rebekah aided the fooling of her husband Isaac in order to help her son Jacob receive the birthright given to him in exchange for a simple meal. We do not endorse a mothers fooling their husbands to help their children, but this does show love and care for her child.

Jochobed loved her son, Mosses, so much that she sent him down the river in a basket, rather than drown him in the water as was the law of Egypt at the time. She then was called to be his wet-nurse after Mosses was rescued from the Nile by Pharaoh's daughter.

Much later, Hannah stayed in the Lord's house night and day praying that she might receive the gift of Motherhood. Hannah even promised to give her son to the Lord, if she was blessed to become a mother. She was, and her son became the great prophet Samuel, who coroneted both King Saul and David.

Mary is perhaps the best known mother in the Bible. She is given the tile Theotokos, the mother of God. She is shown to be a caring and loving mother. Jesus being lost in the temple at 12 years old, shows that Mary was active in Jesus's upbringing and raised Him in the ways of the Lord. Mary was with Jesus when He performed his first Miracle, when he turned the water into wine at the wedding in Cana. Mary was there throughout Christ's ministry, even at the cross as she watched her son die. With some of His last words, Jesus shows care for his mother as He trusts her care to His most beloved disciple, John.

On May 14 we will remember our Mother's. A vocation given by God and shown in scripture to be a blessed one. Let us thank our Mothers this month and always for all the gifts they have given unto us.

HONOR YOUR MOTHER:

Anna Jarvis, the woman who first suggested a national day to honor mothers, had an incredible mother to honor. Her mom, Ann Reeves Jarvis (1832-1905), was a Sunday school teacher and activist who helped lower infant-mortality rates in Appalachia and promoted friendship among families of Civil War soldiers. At a memorial service for her mother. Anna Jarvis distributed carnations — her mom's favorite flower — to attendees. Her idea to set apart one day each year for moms gained traction, and in 1914, President Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday of May Mother's Day. It was customary by then to wear white carnations in honor of departed mothers and red carnations to honor the living. Of the white flowers, Jarvis said they "symbolize the truth, purity and broad-charity of mother love; its fragrance, her memory, and her prayers. The carnation does not drop its petals, but hugs them to its heart as it dies, and so, too, mothers hug their children to their hearts, their mother love never dying."

SCRIP CARDS: The next Scrip order is due to the church office by 9 am on Monday, **May 8**. This is an easy way to get something for everyone without the hassle of shopping in the stores, and these cards are *good anywhere in the USA*. Order forms are on the table in the chapel hallway. Orders are not limited to the vendors listed on the order blank. A complete list of the vendors can be found on their website: www.raiseright.com (note: the website has changed names) or on the hall bulletin board. If your vendor is available write the name of the vendor, denomination of the gift card, number of cards wanted, and total amount on a blank line of the order form. **McDonald's cards are now available with a 2% profit to the church!** These orders will be available for pickup on **May 14** or in the church office after that.

What is Scrip? Scrip cards are gift cards and they come in various amounts. This fundraiser does not cost you anything! For example, you order and receive a \$100 Meijer card and pay \$100 for it. The church gets \$3 (3%) of income from this card, and you buy \$100 worth of groceries, prescriptions, gas, etc. with it. Retailers offer varying rates of profit 1.5% to 13% so the amount the church receives depends on the rate on the individual vendor card. There is a printed list of the vendors and the percentages they give on the bulletin board in the chapel hallway or on their website www.raiseright.com. These cards are good anywhere in the USA and can also be used for confirmation, birthday, graduation, Christmas, new baby, or wedding gifts.


BOARD OF DIRECTORS SUMMARY:

- ILS REPORT: Our current enrollment is 81, which is where we will likely remain for the remainder of the school year. Pre-enrollment for next year is at 64. Brightwheel has been positively received by school families.
- NEW BUSINESS: We need a little more information before proceeding with a new electricity supplier contract. Pastor and Don DeMoss will attend the CSL Internship Placement Service in person. The following positions are up for election at the Voters Meeting in June (date TBD): VP, Finance, Stewardship, Missions and Social Ministry, and Christian Education. The current nominating committee is Don DeMoss, Kim Davis, and Diana Pratt.
- OLD BUSINESS: Scott to follow up with Fred Foster regarding the Sanctuary Media Project. Schaumburg continues to work on their proposal for solar panels.
- FINANCE: Reviewed reports. Sam prepared a proposal to invest \$140,000 in Cd's: \$50,000 bequest money, \$40,000 from the organ fund, \$25,000 from church savings, and \$25,000 from school savings. Budget prep will begin soon.
- PROPERTIES: New guttering was installed above the chapel entrance. Aqua Illinois will replace the church water meter Apr. 28. We are waiting for a quote from Shade Solutions to raise and replace our awning.
- EVANGELISM: 85 Easter bags were delivered to ILS children.
- . WORSHIP: Tom once again thanked all involved in the extra work and special music throughout Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. Ideas were discussed regarding Easter services in upcoming years.
- PARISH ED: Icebox cookies are coming. Volunteers
 are needed on Friday mixing and preparing dough.
 Kohl's Cares will (hopefully) be here to help on
 Saturday for baking and packaging. The Women's
 Guild is purchasing large, sturdy chairs for use during
 events. Need to investigate moving or getting rid of
 the old metal chairs under the stage to make room for
 these chairs.
- MISSIONS & SOCIAL MINISTRY: Reviewed reports from the food pantry and Immanuel Cares. Joyce shared that the annual Immanuel Cares Meeting is scheduled for Apr. 26 at 10 am. As always, new volunteers would be welcomed!
- ELDERS: Don reported that at the last Elders meeting they discussed another chapter of Connected to Christ: Why Membership Matters, the deaconess intern, and leads for potential new elders.

- Membership changes: Pam West passed away, and Kalani Johnson was baptized.
- PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Yonkers gave updates on out homebound and hospitalized members. He discussed Lent and Easter, the hospitalized, deaconess intern planning, confirmation, and VBS.
- VICEPRESIDENT: Office space for our deaconess intern was discussed. Annual backups of computers are needed and ensure that all antivirus and scans are up to date. Budget prep will begin soon. Classroom expansion will be handled by Butch, Scott, and our ILS director.
- PRESIDENT: The cemetery committee met and chose a mowing contractor for the year. We'll need volunteers to help us scan and store our archives, as we will use that space for our deaconess intern, if she is assigned to us. Vocatio registration is still open for youth. Other ideas for youth fellowship include rock climbing and camping. Other ideas are welcome. Need to begin discussing interest in the National Youth Gathering in 2025.

WOMEN'S GUILD: We hope you will join us for the final Women's Guild meeting before we break for summer on Tuesday, May 9 at 11:30 am. Bring a dish to share, everything else is provided. The guild board will meet Thursday, May 4 at 9 am. Many thanks for the donations for the Hope Center during March and April! Our ingathering for May and June is for Dayspring Women's and Children's Shelter at 213 N. Bowman Avenue. They provide emergency long and short term shelter for women and children who find themselves homeless. They are requesting paper products such as toilet paper and paper towels, cleaning supplies, and travel size toiletries such as shampoo and conditioner. No clothing needed at this time.



Did you know?

- **2.1 billion** people worldwide lack access to safe water at home. (WHO)
- 3.7 Miles Women and children in the developing world walk an average of 3.7 miles (6 km) per day to collect water. (USAID). After such an arduous chore, they may arrive late and tired at school. Being 'needed at home' is a major reason why children, especially girls from poor families, drop out of school. (UNICEF)
- **570 million** Nearly 570 million children lack access to basic drinking water at school. (UNICEF)

- 3. Color the two images with markers.
- 4. Apply glue to the backs of the circles and sandwich the top of the straw between them so it looks like a lollipop. Let dry.

"Witnessing While We Wait"

For those who are in Christ Jesus, waiting does not mean fear. And waiting does not mean worry. In our Baptism, we have been given the power of the Holy Spirit, and the purpose of that power is that we may believe the promise of life that will come with Christ's return, and that we may witness while we wait.




