Roman Catholicism makes claims to be the original or the true church; don't worry Lutheran's make such claims, too. As we begin Bible study this fall and look at different branches of Christianity, I thought it fitting to look at our own church, the Lutheran Church. I have heard many different views from non-Lutherans on who and what we Lutherans are. The Roman Catholics think we are Protestant, and the Protestants think we are Catholics. You know, I am not sure either of them is wrong. We are "traditional". Even our contemporary services look liturgical to many in the protestant world.

Our confessions even declare that we support the historic Liturgy, our order of service. Attending a Roman Catholic Mass with my friends, I always felt at home, for I knew most of the responses by heart. Martin Luther even wrote a service in German known simply as "Die Deutsche Masse", or The German Mass. Our Divine Services are known by many in our own church body as masses. Yet, the theology contained within our Divine services, in our masses, is different from Catholicism.

Listen to the words of the offertory "What shall I render to the Lord". Our sacrifices are not proprietary. A pastor earns nothing salvific for officiating a mass, and an individual earns nothing for mere attendance, that is apart from faith, either. In the offertory we sing "I will offer the sacrifice of Thanksgiving". That is what we do, and what the Lutheran Church has always done. In Scripture, communion is often referred to as the Eucharist, or the "Thanksgiving". Christ's atonement is complete. He paid for it all. He continually gives of Himself at His Table. We have nothing to give and nothing to do. Our views on the Eucharist alone separate us from Rome.

Yet, we don't really agree with the Protestants either. We do not try and lock Christ up in heaven. We know He is not too remote, too sovereign, to truly interact or to truly come to His people. We simply believe His words. "This *is* my body". "This *is* my blood". No imagery, no metaphor, just a simple statement of fact. Communion is not a symbol or representation. The body and blood of Christ are truly present. Ever heard Lutherans talk of the body and blood of Christ being IN, WITH, and UNDER the bread and wine? Lutherans use these words to ward off heretical thinking about the Lord's Supper that can easily come about if we delve away from scripture and into our own reason and understanding.

Likewise, we do not try to improve the communion elements or make them more pliable to our hearts and minds or to our own liking. We use what Jesus used, we use what Jesus directed us to: unleavened bread and wine. We do this not because we are drunkards, but because these are the elements Jesus used. These are the elements Jesus commanded us to use. So, we see that as Lutherans we do not agree with Protestants either, for grape juice is not permitted, and neither is leaven bread.

As Lutherans we lie in the middle. Neither Roman Catholic nor Protestant. In Sunday's Adult Bible Study, we will look at our unique Lutheran identity and the rest of the whole Christian church on earth. We will look at the sources of authority and the way the different church bodies see scripture and the sacraments. Come and study with us!

Stewardship in the First Commandment: The greatest gift that Martin Luther gave to us was his Small Catechism. The word "enchiridion" is part of the original title of this work. This is the Greek word for "handbook." The Small Catechism is a handbook of the Bible. All the basic knowledge that a Christian needs to understand the faith and live a godly life has been taken from the Bible and distilled into this beautiful little book of Christian piety. Luther starts with the Ten Commandments. The First Commandment: You shall have no other gods. What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. We have a God above us. He is the Lord God and we are not. He is Almighty and in control. He is righteous and good. And therefore, we should fear Him. This God is also our heavenly Father. He wants us to be saved. He does not want us to suffer His just wrath. He has provided salvation for us in His Son, Jesus Christ. And therefore, we should love Him. Our heavenly Father will never leave us nor forsake us. He has promised as much — and the Bible shows us that He always keeps His promises. So, we should trust Him. In the Large Catechism, Luther explains how money and possessions form one of the greatest temptations against the First Commandment: This I must unfold somewhat more plainly, that it may be understood and perceived by ordinary examples of the contrary. Many a one thinks that he has God and everything in abundance when he has money and possessions; he trusts in them and boasts of them with such firmness and assurance as to care for no one. Lo, such a man also has a god, Mammon by name, i.e., money and possessions, on which he sets all his heart, and which is also the most common idol on earth. He who has money and possessions feels secure, and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of Paradise. On the other hand, he who has none doubts and is despondent, as though he knew of no God. For very few are to be found who are of good cheer, and who neither mourn nor complain if they have not Mammon. This [care and desire for money] sticks and clings to our nature, even to the grave. These words of Dr. Luther should call us to repentance; sometimes, we live and act like we don't have a Father in heaven. We seek our comfort and peace outside of His gracious promises. But we do have a Father in heaven. He does love us. All His promises are true. And the Lord will surely provide. If that is our belief, then our outward lives will reflect our belief in our acts of generosity and mercy. We will see money and possessions not as gods but rather as tools for doing God's work.

EXCITING NEWS! Construction has begun on our new covered entrance that will replace our awning. Over the years, our awning has been hit, causing thousands of dollars in damage each time. This new, permanent structure will be taller and wider to prevent that issue and will look similar to the one at First Baptist Church on Vermilion. PATRIOT DAY: On December 18, 2001, Congress approved a joint resolution designating September 11 of each year as "Patriot Day." It's a day to remember the more than 3,000 innocent lives lost on that September morning in 2001. The resolution requests that each year the President issue a proclamation calling on the American people and state and local governments to observe the day with appropriate programs and activities. Those activities include remembrance services, candlelight vigils, moments of silence, and flying the American flag at half-staff. In his 2003 proclamation President Bush said, "On that day, and in

its aftermath, we saw the greatness of America in the bravery of victims; in the heroism of first responders who laid down their lives to save others; in the compassion of people who stepped forward to help those they had never met; and in the generosity of millions of Americans who enriched our country with acts of service and kindness." Keep them all in your prayers this Patriot Day.

SCRIP ORDERS: The next Scrip order is due to the church office by 9 am on Monday, Sept. 11. Updated order blanks are on the table in the chapel hallway; please use these for your orders and throw away your old blanks. Orders are not limited to the vendors listed on the order blank; if you want to check if your favorite vendor participates in the Scrip program, you can find a full vendor list and check the availability online at raiseright.com/resources/organization or see the list posted in the hallway bulletin board. If your vendor is available write the name of the vendor, denomination of the gift card, number of cards wanted, and total amount on a blank line of the order form. The following have been added to the vendor list: McDonald's (2% profit), Casey's Gas (3% profit), Saltgrass Steakhouse (9% profit), Jimmy John's Subs (8% profit), and Sonic (when it opens) with an 8% profit to the church. These orders will be available for pickup on Sunday, Aug. 20, or in the church office after that, or you may make special arrangements with Jo Van Hoveln. Selected cards are available all the time; they are most of the local fast food/chain restaurants (with varying rates of profit to the church), plus Meijer and Wal-Mart. If you have questions, please see Jo Van Hoveln, Judy Creek. or Kim Davis.

SCRIP CARD EXPLANATION: The cards come in various amounts and can be used just like a credit/debit card at the designated vendor. For example, you order and get a \$100 Meijer card. The church gets \$3 (3%) of income from this card, and you buy \$100 worth of groceries, prescriptions, gas, etc. with it. There are varying rates on these cards from 1.5% to 13% so the amount the church receives depends on the rate on the individual vendor card. There is a printed list of the vendors and the percentages they give on the bulletin board and at www.raiseright.com/resources/organization. These cards are good anywhere in the USA and can also be used for confirmation, birthday, graduation, Christmas, new baby, or wedding gifts.

CAPITAL FUND DRIVE: The current bank balance is \$32,902.00. Our current project is the resealing of the north part of the parking lot and a couple of other areas for \$17,435. The north parking lot area will also have stripes for parking. There are special envelopes at the ushers' desk and between the Stewardship bulletin board by the coat room and member mailboxes. The Capital Fund was established in 2012, and thanks to you, our generous congregation, we have accomplished many much needed upgrades and renovations. Prior generations worked and sacrificed to build the school/church building, and it is up to us to preserve and improve our church home just as we would our own household's. There is a list of projects completed and the costs on the Capital Fund bulletin board (between the mailboxes and the coat room); please stop by and check it out. There are special envelopes at the same bulletin board for ongoing donations throughout the year. BOARD OF DIRECTORS SUMMARY:

- New Business: The end of the year financial reports were reviewed in detail and a motion to close to FY 2022-2023 was passed. An outdoor pavilion was discussed. The board of directors would like to begin a committee to plan for the future of Immanuel that would cover topics such as building the congregation, adapting our worship style while remaining doctrinally sound, staffing, etc.
- Old Business: Our increased deductible from Church Mutual Insurance was discussed following their response that are unable to lower our deductible below \$10,000. We will call around to churched of comparable size for recommendations and call for quotes.
- Christian Education: Enrollment is currently at 96 students! Kurt thanked everyone who has worked to prepare the school. We are fully staffed. Meet the Teacher was successful with an estimated 95% of school families in attendance! The Christian Ed Committee decided to designate \$5000 of school savings for Zora Drews. We will continue with 5th Sunday door offerings, along with three other Sundays when school families are in attendance. Other ideas to fund Zora Drews Scholarships include additional fundraisers like Advent/Lenten suppers.
- **Finance:** Financial reports were reviewed. Sam reported that we received \$26,000 from Thrivent as a bequest. These are undesignated funds so 25% will go to our organ fund, with the remaining 75% to stay in savings. We still have 4 months to go on our Vibrant CDs.
- **Properties:** The old awning is gone and the footings for the new permanent structure have been poured. The 3 door refrigerator went out and a new 2 door commercial fridge was ordered. It was in stock so it should arrive quickly. The old one will be taken out to Mervis for scrap.
- **Stewardship:** The date for the Fall Rummage and Bake Sale is set for Oct. 6 & 7.
- **Worship:** Church in the Park will be Aug. 27 at the Lincoln Park pavilion. Choir and handbells will begin the first week of September.
- **Parish Education:** Christian Education Sunday will be Oct. 15 and will coincide with the LWML missionary visit. We will install ILS teachers and staff and Sunday School teachers and helpers during the service followed by a potluck lunch with a brief presentation by the missionary on her work in Puerto Rico.
- **Youth:** Sue DeMoss will make the youth room available on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month and presented ideas from the youth on how they envision the youth room to look.

- **Missions:** Reviewed Reports.
- Elders: Elders discussed our Usher teams. We would like to add a youth team, led by an adult, and allow women to serve as ushers. The board approved both and Josh has already spoken to Ray Wittmann as head usher. Kim will update the schedule once we know who would like to join our usher teams.
- **Deaconess Intern:** A new idea for Rachel would be to have her lead a post high school young adult or young married couples Bible Study on Sundays.
- Vice President: Butch is working with Christian Education. Annual employee reviews will be completed soon.
- President: No report.
