- 2. What important thing happened today at school? Do you want to talk about it?
- 3. I love you! I am pleased with you!

"Every day in a hundred small ways our children ask, 'Do you see me? Do you hear me? Do I matter?' Their behavior often reflects our response." All of us could benefit! Imagine your boss if asked you about vour dav and listened with care rather than talking down to you! Imagine if you and your spouse talked to one another like this each day!!
