# From our School Director

"Life is like a box of chocolates," Do you remember that line in a movie? Then: "you never know what you're going to get!!"

That quote came to mind recently as I was thinking about Preschooler emotions! Truly, you don't know how they're going to react: offer a child the wrong color sippy cup and they explode, why?! They might cry when you expect them to laugh; and then laugh when you expect them to cry. Why? Well, think about your emotions when someone really hurts your feelings, or you get really bad news, etc. It's hard for us as adults to get a grasp on our emotions and sometimes we fail to control an emotional outburst; but we've had years of life experience. Preschoolers in their second or fourth year of life don't have a lot of experience; and emotions are hard and wild! That's why it's best for parents, grandparents, and teachers not to overreact when a child is having their fourth meltdown cry of the day because their shoe came off, or another child took their toy. This is a great time to just listen and a teachable moment about a particular emotion which may be a new concept to him/her. So if your toddler is screaming at you because they wanted a spoon and not a fork & spoon, relax; and calmly help them relax. Know that logic won't sway them; just keep loving them and keep talking about emotions and how to relax through the stress. And if your emotions are raging, take a break and don't explode in front of the child. Show them how you use a skill like counting to 10 (or 50) or refocusing on something pleasant! Oh, and you may have to repeat this thirty times in the next month ... relax! Your child is learning and growing each time!
